

SUES TO GET EVEN

Liveryman Moran Wants \$500 for Damages

FOR THE KILLING OF HIS HORSE

By the Cars of the Consolidated Street Railway Company—News of the Several City Courts.

James P. Moran, the liveryman, filed a declaration in the circuit court yesterday as the beginning of a suit against the Consolidated Street Railway company in a plea of trespass on the case. The complaint sets forth that Mr. Moran let a team and sleigh to John H. Lundin and August Jensen on January 17 last, and as they were driving down College avenue and across Lyon street the team was struck by a car and one of the horses was injured so it had to be killed and the other was greatly damaged. The sleigh and harness were also broken and damaged. It is further declared that the car was running at a speed in excess of fifteen miles an hour and that no signal was given of its approaching the intersection of the streets; also that by reason of the buildings and other obstructions the driver of the team was unable to see the approaching car and until by reason of the lack of a warning signal it was impossible to stop the team. The amount of damages sought is \$500.

PAID HIM TOO MUCH. A Cashier and a Poland Dispute Over a Check.

Hoyt G. Post, cashier of the Old National bank, caused the arrest yesterday afternoon of Frank Salik, a Polish wood dealer, doing business on East Bridge street. Mr. Post claims that Salik presented a check for 25 cents and that by mistake he paid him \$25. He discovered the error afterwards and demanded that the Pole return \$24.75. Salik denied that he received \$25, and said that Mr. Post had paid him but 25 cents. Salik was locked up without process and considerable indignation was created because the cashier declined to swear to a complaint until after banking hours. George A. Thompson, attorney for the respondent, called the attention of Judge Haggerty to what he dubbed an outrage on the part of the banker, and asked that the prisoner be discharged if some arrangements made by which the amount of a necessary bond for his appearance could be determined upon. Judge Haggerty said the matter had not yet come under his jurisdiction. Salik was forced to wait until the complaint was sworn to before he was liberated on bail.

DENT MAKES A DEFENSE. He Claims that His Transactions Were Honorable.

In the Richard Dent embezzlement case now on trial in the superior court the people rested yesterday and the defense began its side. Dent was the first witness sworn. He claims to have had a settlement with the Home Life Insurance company January 1, 1891, and to have had an understanding with State Agent Haskell in regard to business transacted after that date. There was a difference of \$250 when he left the Home Insurance company, so Haskell said, but he claimed there was nothing; that he had commissions coming to him to that amount. Haskell had revoked some policies which he had taken and cut down his commission without him knowing it. The case will go to the jury today.

WHALEN ON THE RUN. The Base Ball Player Tries To Escape a Put-Out.

The police and sheriff's force were notified yesterday by a constable at Sparta to look out for John Whalen who jumped through a window at the hotel and escaped while under arrest. He had been arrested at Sparta on a charge preferred by Miss Tina Kelley, a waiter in the hotel where he boarded. He has a wife and family in Battle Creek. Whalen is a base ball player of some notoriety, having caught for the old Grand Rapids nine, and last season was with the Welch folding bed nine of Sparta. It is thought he made a four-base hit and will make a home run.

MYERS MUST SETTLE. A Detroit Circuit Renders a Judgment Against Him.

The Phoenix Furniture company of this city obtained a verdict in the Detroit circuit court yesterday for \$1051.28 against Architect E. E. Myers of that city. The suit was brought to recover \$1100 for furniture bought by Mr. Myers in 1885. He put in an asset claim for 5 per cent commission for two sales made by the company for the interior woodwork for the state capital at Austin, Tex., and the court bought at Galesburg, Ill., which he claims he was instrumental in securing. The commission claimed amounted to \$5350.

WOOD WAS ACQUITTED. A Jury Finds That He Was Not Guilty of Cruelty.

Michael Wood was tried by a jury in the police court yesterday for cruelty to animals. He was arrested on complaint of Liveryman Moran. The alleged offense was committed last November. Wood hired a team and drove to Helling, a distance of thirty-two miles. When he reached his destination, one of the horses dropped dead. Wood claimed that he did not overdrive the team. That one of the horses died the trip all right, which was convincing evidence to him that the other was not in good condition. The case occupied the entire day. The jury brought in a verdict of not guilty.

Mistakes Are Apt to Happen. One of these annoying errors came to all newspapers was permitted to pass in an item concerning the arrest of two women in Detroit for removing goods purchased on the installment plan. The item made it appear that the Wingers Furniture company made the complaint instead of Hering & Co. The only excuse for the error is that such mistakes are apt to happen in the best of families.

Carried Concealed Weapons. Richard Westlake was sentenced to fifteen days in jail yesterday by Judge Haggerty. He pleaded guilty in carrying concealed weapons. He was arrested on East Bridge street Wednesday night. Earlier in the evening he had visited his brother-in-law, Andrew Allison, who accused him of stealing \$100. He growing suspect and searched

his revolver, frightening everybody out of the house. He at first thought he was arrested on complaint of Allison and did not learn until today that he was arrested for being drunk. The revolver was found on his person at headquarters.

Filed Examination Papers. Justice Hydon filed his examination with the county clerk yesterday in the case of the people against Peter Thomas, charged with murdering James Johnson, a colored veteran at the soldiers' home. Thomas was held for trial at the present term of the circuit court.

Not Worth Prosecuting. Thomas Goodwin, who is serving a twenty-year sentence in the house of correction at Lonia, for highway robbery, had a case of larceny standing against him in the circuit court. The prosecuting attorney thought it was not worth while to hold the case open, and upon his motion it was nolle pro'd.

Settled by Defendants. The defendants in the suit of Percy T. Cook vs. H. J. Haven and L. B. Beebe, agreed to come to terms and the suit was withdrawn. The suit was brought by Cook as administrator of his father's estate in Livingston county, to eject the defendants from the property. It was brought here by change of venue.

No Witness Appeared. When the suit against Jarvis C. Train of Lowell, was called in the circuit court yesterday morning the complaining witness was not on hand and the case was nolle pro'd. Train was arrested last summer on a charge of keeping a gambling hall at Lowell.

Both Pleaded Guilty. Mrs. L. Morse and Mrs. C. Spaulding, the women who moved furniture leased from Heyman & Co., to Detroit, pleaded guilty in police court yesterday. They paid the costs and were discharged, having agreed to return the goods.

Doyle Jumped His Board. William Doyle, who jumped a board bill at the Bridge street house, was arrested yesterday and arraigned in police court. He acknowledged his guilt. Judge Haggerty sentenced him to jail for thirty days.

Preston Gets Seven Years. Herman B. Preston, formerly of this city, has been sentenced from Lansing to the Jackson prison for seven years for forging an assignment of a mortgage.
