HAVE YOU LOST ANY

The Way the Railroad Companies Trace Lost Freight

PATIENCE AND PERSISTENCE

Will Reward the Impertunate Loser, but it Takes a Great Deal of Both to Secure the Goods.

One not versed in such matters would naturally suppose that as railroad companies are so prompt in all other respects, legitimate claims would be paid without delay, but the reader who has occasion to present a bill for damage or overcharge knows better. Let us suppose, for example, says the Philadelphian Times, that a party here orders half a dozen cases of some sort of goods from the Pacific coast. In due time he receives notice from one of the freight lines entering the city that the property is at that station and must be removed within twenty-four hours, etc. He goes to the depot, pays the freight bill, and when sending for the goods finds one case missing. He reports the matter to the freight office and the clerk talks "substantially covers" and "shorts," "stray freight" and other things which he doesn't understand nor care about. To him it is a hard, cold fact that his box is missing, and as far as he is concerned, it makes no difference whether it is under or over, short or long, provided it is delivered to him promptly. The clerk promises to trace the missing package and the consignee goes away silenced, but not satisfied. After waiting a week he goes again to the station, and the urbane clerk informs him no tidings have yet been received. Another week rolls by, and once more the anxious owner presents himself. The employe is so sorry that the box cannot be found. They have been telegraphing all over the country endeavoring to locate it, and the matter has been given personal attention by the agent. The missing property will surely be found in a few days.

The consignee believes down in his heart that the railroad company has taken no action whatever toward tracing the shipment, but what he feels flattered when told that his case has had special attention, and, representing his wrath, he goes away to bide a space longer. Finally, indignation getting the better of his feelings, he creates a commotion to locate it, and the matter, which, however, has no visible effect upon the clerk, who is accustomed to such demonstrations. The enraged citizen is instructed to send his bill for the missing box to the claim agent. This he does, and in return receives a request from that office to substantiate his claim with the bill of lading and the paid freight bill. Not being familiar with shipping affairs, he was called to get the bill of lading from the shippers, and two or three weeks elapse ere he can obtain and transmit it, together with the freight receipt, to the claim office.

Through the Circumlocution Office. The claim is now fairly launched, some two or three months after the box was found to be missing. Days pass by, weeks roll into months, and no word or remittance comes to the claimant. Some three months after the bill has been rendered he visits the claim office and demands settlement. He is told the papers are in the hands of connecting roads, and that nothing can be done until they are returned. The employe explains to him that the ground on which the claim is being made is not a claim for the box, but a claim for the freight, and that the western roads are so slow in attending to such matters. Another long period elapses, and when he again decides to visit the claim office, there is blood in his eye and vengeance in his heart. He, however, good news awaits him. Authority has been received to pay the claim for account of connecting lines, and the claimant is informed that a voucher will at once be made in his favor, and a remittance will reach him in a few days. Three long months later it comes along, some six months after the presentation of the claim.

That these delays in making settlement for lost property are annoying and vexatious cannot even be denied by railroad officials, but the person who thinks that the papers in his hands have been pigeon-holed, and that adjustment of the matter is not made from lack of interest or attention on the part of the corporation is very much mistaken. The amount of work involved in handling a \$2 or \$3 claim for a missing article is prodigious, and beyond doubt the actual cost of investigating such matters more than exceeds the amount of the bill. When a shipment or a part of a shipment is reported missing, steps are at once taken to ascertain its whereabouts, so that possible claims may be avoided, and in many cases property which has gone astray is found and sent to its destination so promptly that the owner is unaware that it has not come directly from the shippers. Losses on local shipments, as a rule, can be adjusted promptly, the ground on which the claim is being made. If goods shipped from a city station to some way station are "short"—that is, not received at destination—the first proceeding toward finding them is to ascertain for what other stations freight was placed in the same car, and then to inquire of the agents at those points whether the articles in question have been received by them.

Knowing Down Lost Freight. If not found a general tracer is started at one end of the line, the agent to whom it is addressed being instructed to carefully search the warehouse, and failing to discover the property to so notify the shippers and then to forward it to the next station, where a similar search will be made. When the tracer reaches the other end of the line it is returned to the claim office. If the shipment is still missing the resources of the department are not yet exhausted, either can be looked at by name time as the case in which the property should have been placed are followed up and traced until empty. It thus often happens that a box destined to a local point is found hundreds of miles away, having been improperly loaded. Connecting lines, as a rule, report stray freight to the road from which they were sent, but it is not always possible

to ascertain from what point an article comes after it has been unloaded from a car.

All this investigation requires time, and when the missing property is a part of the through shipment the routine must be gone over again and again, with each transferring station as a starting point. Notwithstanding the intricate system of checking in vogue on all the railroads, goods will disappear in the most unaccountable manner, and when repeated searches fail to locate them the owners must be compensated for their loss. On a local shipment, there being but one corporation interested, the responsibility cannot be evaded, but in the case of a through shipment passing over a dozen lines the question is not so easily disposed of. Should the car have gone through from shipping point to destination without being opened, and with the lead seals placed on the doors at starting point unbroken, the records of the initial road showing that the property was put into the car, while those of the delivering line are as positive that it was not in it when the seals were removed, the claim is usually adjusted by each of the two roads paying one-half of the bill.

There are so many technicalities upon which claims are rejected by railroad companies, and so much annoyance and delay attending their adjustment, that no doubt there are scores of business men who would gladly dispose of their claims outright for 50 per cent cash of their face value, without making an effort to get settlement in full direct from the carriers.

Chopped a Hole in the Barn. Evert Kwakernaak, charged with malicious destruction to personal property, had his trial before Judge Westfall yesterday. He and his wife had some trouble concerning the right of way through a piece of land. After some dispute Evert decided that the proper thing for him to do would be to chop a hole through Caster's barn, ruin \$10 worth of paints, and smash a wagon box. He did it, and the court thought \$20 would be the correct amount to pay. In default of this, the gentleman with the unpronounceable name will spend sixty days in jail.

Arraigned the "Hobos." Ed Troy, the "hobo," charged with deadly assault on Officer Tatro, was arraigned in police court yesterday, and his case was adjourned until June 5. Tatro being too sick to appear. The case of John Granger, William O'Donnell, James Powers, Wady Poliski, William Murphy, Fred Clifton, William Michael and Alex Adams, charged with resisting an officer, was adjourned one week.

Wishes It Set Aside. Leonard M. VanHeulen petitions to have a mortgage set aside. This mortgage is on certain property that he bought of Flossie DeVries and others which was represented to be mortgaged for \$600. He took a warranty deed, but afterwards found that a mortgage of \$2000 had been placed on the property and he asks that it be set aside.

Granted an Injunction. A temporary injunction has been issued against Sarah L. Boynton, restraining her from removing sand from the hill near the flat built by Jerry Boynton on Ransom street. Clair Fogg, owner of the property in the rear, desired the injunction as dirt was being removed from the alley back of that property.

Prays For an Accounting. The case of L. M. Cutchson vs. Daniel E. Corbett was up before Circuit Court Commissioner Hughes yesterday. Corbett was receiver for the firm of Buchanan & Mizner, and Cutchson asks for an accounting of the receiver.

Obstructed an Officer. A warrant has been issued for Mat Steeland, charged with obstructing Officer Fitzpatrick, who arrested a member of a gang that infests West Second street for being drunk and disorderly.

Ill Treated the Horse. Ray Detrich, the young man who overdrove a livery horse, pleaded guilty of ill treating animals, and was fined \$5 and costs yesterday in police court.

William Gets a Divorce. William E. Sykes was granted a decree of divorce from Maggie Sykes in circuit court yesterday. The custody of a minor child was given to William.

New Suits Begun. William H. Hoops vs. John B. White, trespass. Kusterer Brewing company vs. Friar Brothers, trespass on the case.

Police Court Notes. Charles C. Rneicher, charged with keeping his saloon open Sunday, had a partial hearing in police court yesterday. The final hearing was deferred to June 3.
