WORK IN A SWEAT SHOP. The Chicago sweat shop is a place where, separate from the tailor shop or clothing warehouse, a "sweater" (middleman) assembles journeymen tailors and needlewomen, to work under his supervision.

He takes a cheap room outside the crowded business center and within the neighborhood where the work people live. Thus is rent saved to the employer and time and travel to the employed. The men can do work more hours than was possible under the centralized system, and their wives and children can help, especially when, as is often done, the garments are taken home to be "finished."

The entire number of persons employed in these occupations may be stated at 8,000 men (of whom 300 are Jews) and from 20,000 to 23,000 women and children. The wages are reckoned by "piecework," and outside the "finishing" run about as follows: Girls, hand-sewers, earn nothing for the first month, then as unskilled workers they get \$1 to \$1.50 a week, \$3 a week, and as skilled workers, \$6 a week. The first named class constitutes 50 per cent of all, the second 30 per cent, and the last 20 per cent.
