Commercial Reports Show a Wonderful Increase Over Last Year's Business—Unable to Fill Orders.

New York, Oct. 20.—R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade will say: There is still no cloud in the business sky, unless the state of foreign trade be one.

Exports in September were but \$82,949,526 in value, against \$82,904,085 last year, a great decline, due mainly to the fact that last year's movement was far behind all precedent.

Increase in exports.—Cotton exports were 21,000,000 pounds less and the price \$7.25 against \$9.37 last year. Oil exports were larger, 65,000,000 against 60,000,000 gallons, but the price was one cent larger.
