

IS NOT HIS CHILD

Fred Leonard Says the Child Involved in the

CONTEST WITH HIS BROTHERS

In the Child of His Sister and Has Been Adopted by Him—The Affidavits in the Case.

The case of Fred H. Leonard against his brothers for a dissolution of partnership and division of the estate of H. Leonard, now held jointly by the brothers, occupied the morning session of Judge Groves' court yesterday.

The defendants filed a motion to continue the case until the petition now pending in the probate court shall be settled. The hearing of the petition before Judge Perkins is held for November 21.

The defendants' motion for a continuance was supported by an affidavit of Frank H. Leonard, who says that his brother is mentally incompetent to transact business or to protect his own interests.

The complainant's statements. The complainant objects to a delay and in a personal affidavit recites the trouble between himself and brothers and charges them with mercenary motives.

The affidavit also states that the affiant is not now nor ever was mentally incompetent to attend to his business affairs and is not of unsound mind.

During the reading of the affidavit it was shown that the alleged infant son of Fred Leonard is not his child, but is the daughter of Mrs. Harry Knight, Leonard's deceased sister, and had been legally adopted by her about a month ago.

The motion to stay proceedings was argued by Messrs. Wally and Smiley for Charles E. and Frank H. Leonard, and R. W. Butterfield, attorney for the Michigan Trust company, and submitted.
