CLARKSON'S GREAT SPEECH

He Advises the Members to Watch Among the Young Voters Casting Their First Ballots.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 10.—Undismayed by the rout of a few months ago the representatives of the young republicans of the United States assembled in annual convention at Macaulay's theater this morning.

Significant Inscription.

Spurred to promptitude by an invitation to witness the Kentucky derby in the afternoon the delegates were lively in getting together, and by 10 o'clock, the hour designated in the official call, every seat on the main floor as well as in the balcony and gallery had its occupant.

A Kentucky Welcome.

The convention was opened with prayer by the Rev. Dr. J. H. Heywood of the unitarian church. Mayor Tyler, who was heartily cheered, delivered the address of welcome in behalf of the city.

President Clarkson's Address.
