MONEY IS MUCH EASIER

The Northern Pacific Will Soon Pay Off Its Floating Debt, and That Interests Brokers.

New York, May 18.—Money on call has been easy, ranging from 2 1/2 to 2 per cent. last loan at 2 per cent. and closing offered at 2 per cent.

Government bonds have been firm. The stock market while irregular again today was in the main higher.

The volume of business was moderately large, the sales aggregating 22,235 shares, of which 2,746 were unlisted.

The advance in the bank of England discount rate from 3 1/2 to 4 per cent had little influence upon the market.

The affairs of the Northern Pacific company communicated an unusual share of attention. The directors held long sessions and it is understood that arrangements have been completed whereby the company will be enabled to pay off its floating debt.

A Woman Who Knows Not What Fear Is. An Unnoted correspondent sends a bit of the history of Mrs. Taylor Oliver, which shows that the pluck exhibited by that fearless woman during the murder case attack upon herself, her husband and her daughter has been characteristic of her during life.

Many years ago Mr. Daniels, the father of Mrs. Oliver, was what was known at that time as a slave driver. During that time he incurred, of course, the hatred of the negro race.

When Daniels was living with his family in Jefferson county, a band of negroes determined secretly to murder him and his entire family. A night was selected and a party called his house in the dead of night and made an attack.

Daniels defended himself as best he could, and Mrs. Oliver, then 17 years of age, shouldered a gun and took a position by the side of her father. In the melee there was a great loss of life, and when the smoke of battle had passed away seven dead negroes remained upon the spot on the attacking side, and some of the Danesles were injured. Mrs. Oliver, it is said, did the best shooting, and her shots were more effective than those of her father. She does not know what fear is, as she has proved in her recent and most trying ordeal.—Henderson Glensier.
