

THEY SHOW UP WELL.

Youngsters at the Comstock Track Are Daily Making

SOME UNUSUALLY FAST MILES

Jennie Hawthorne Trotted a Half in 1:10 1-2 and Doty Paced a Half in 1:00 1-2—Some Records.

Youngsters at Comstock park are gradually working down into racing track, and are showing up better every day.

Yesterday Roland worked out his string and made some very fine times. Ripplet, by Falon, was stopped a quarter in .58, the last eighth being made in .10. Fanny, by Patagonia, was stopped in .59, but has not been out since.

Snail worked out Dashwood, Jr., in 2:34, Alena, a 3-year old, by Alcyon, stopped a mile in 2:40; Jim C., by Fairlane Medium, went an eighth in .10, a 2:38 gait. Snail drove the truck to be in bag-up shape—as good as he ever saw a course.

George Robens had his horse all out yesterday, and worked them down for some good miles. Claus Almont, by Santa Claus, was sent three miles, one in 2:34, the second in 2:32, and the last in 2:27. Albert came under the wire in 2:34 the first trial. In the second he made 2:30 and repeated the time on the third trip. Monte Cristo made the distance in 2:28. Robens sent him over the course the second time in 2:31. The third mile was made in 2:29, and the last half in 1:11. Albert's record was good, but Jennie Hawthorne called the turn on him. She went her first mile in 2:28, the second in 2:30 and shot under the wire the third time in 2:24. She stepped the last half in 1:04. A 2:24 gait had her an hour at this stage of the game, and Jennie is being depended upon for a rapid clip before snow flies.

Johnson had Doty, the promising young pacer, out for an airing yesterday morning. Doty made a mile easily in 2:29 and finished the last half in 1:05.5.

More Arrivals. Samuel A. Brown & Co. have written for seven more stalls at the track. They have thirteen horses there now.

Alcyon Girl, by Alcyon, stepped a quarter yesterday in .45 and an eighth in .20. Artisan trotted a mile easily in 2:45. Artisan, by Warwick Medium, came under the string in 2:30, the last half being made in the excellent time of 1:10.5.

Walter K, by Fairlane Medium, made the course in 2:37, and in a second trial reduced the time to 2:33.

A. M. Robinson's Fremont arrived at the track yesterday with six. Among them are Ben O'Neil, by Louis Napoleon, dam by Phil Sheridan; Salisbury, bay colt, by Judge Salisbury, dam Mary S. 2:28, by Barney Wilkes; Alena, bay mare, by Alena, a son of Alcyon.

FOURTH OF JULY MATINEE.

Horsemen Are Arranging for One at the Comstock Track.

The Driving club will hold a Fourth of July matinee at Comstock park if satisfactory transportation arrangements can be made. It is probable that three races will be trotted, for purses of \$100 each. The entries will be limited to horses in training on the track. It is thought that some lively races can be arranged for. The drivers at the track will be stimulated to a little rivalry, and the public can see some hotly contested heats, which are just as interesting as if the time were faster.

At a meeting of the Driving club last night a schedule of prices for the August meeting was agreed upon. The general admittance will be 50 cents; 25 cents extra will be charged for grand stand seats, and 50 cents extra for chairs. The boxes will be rented for \$2.50 each.
