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CAN YOU AFFORD IT?

Pointed Questions Put Plainly to Advertisers.

WHO ARE SHAKY JUST NOW

Reasons Why Merchants Should Continue to Keep Their Names and Names Before the Public.

The money panic of the last two months has prompted quite a number of the leading advertisers of the country to the view which, in our opinion, they will regret in the end. We allude to the discontinuance of advertising contracts on account of threatened hard times.

The successful advertisers are those who have kept eternally at it. The human memory is short. The law of competition admits of no armistice. There can be no permanent vacancy in the grand army of advertising.

Demand is Eternal. Human wants are substantially invariable, and the quantity of things purchased for the needs of existence cannot be permanently lessened.

Cannot Afford to Withdraw. We call attention to this truism because just at this time, as stated in the heading, there are a number of the best known advertisers who seem to be flinching from the strain imposed upon active business, and to soothe their better judgment with the idea that their place was certain, and that their trade was established, and that their battle with competitors might be suspended without loss to themselves.

No Cause for Alarm. The most astute financiers of the country are unable to point to any adequate cause for the late disaster. Our people have not been prostrated by an epidemic war; famine has not devastated our fields or cities; no great conflagration has swept up millions; but on the other hand we have just past a year of bountiful crops, fruitful vines, beneficent weather and intensely active business.

Fort Scott is Dry. Post Scott, Kan., Aug. 24.—Attorney General Little ordered the republican sheriff and populist county attorney of Bourbon county to shut the joints of this city without further parleying. The officers lost no time in doing so, for they perceived that Mr. Little meant business this time.

Iron and Steel Plant to Be Sold. West Swanton, Wis., Aug. 24.—Notice was posted here today informing the public that the contemplated sale of the West Superior Iron and Steel company's plant is postponed until September 15.

Two Vessels Wrecked. LOOKFORD, N. E., Aug. 24.—Much destruction was done to shipping here by the recent heavy gales. Reports from Sand Point and Jordan tell of large losses by fishermen. Ten vessels lying at anchor in the harbor here were driven ashore and will be total losses.

Arkansas City, Kan., Aug. 24.—There is a movement here among old soldiers to make test case of their right to declare their intention of settling on any specified quarter in the strip and taking advantage of section 24 and 25, revised statutes of the United States and the Oklahoma law to protect them.
