SHIP BURNED AT SEA

Explosion Aboard the Alexandria Set it Afire. THIRTY-FIVE LIVES WERE LOST. Twenty-five Persons Aboard the ship Were Rescued by Tugs Sent Out From Havana.

HAVANA, Nov. 2.—The steamship City of Alexandria, belonging to the New York and Cuba Mail Steamship company, from Havana and Matanzas for New York, has been burned off Cujamar. The news was brought to the city early this morning, when a small boat in which were the second officer and eleven other persons from the City of Alexandria entered the harbor and reported the loss of the steamer.

There was comparatively little sea running and but slight difficulty was experienced in lowering away the boats when the bell forward tolled the signal, "abandon the ship." The scene at the burning of the steamer was little more than a few miles from Havana. The ship was in command of the boat had little fear of reaching that port or some other place along the coast.
