



# GEN. YOUNG LOST

Otis Says No Word Has Been Received From Him for a Week.

Supposed Young Is Continuing His Vigorous Pursuit of Aguinaldo.

Official Account of the Fight at Vigan---Americans Lost Eight.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 .- General Otis has cabled the war department that he has had no news from General Young for a week. This taken to indicate that Young is continuing his hot pursuit of Aguinaldo, and probably is in a country where he regards it as unsafe to use couriers. General Otis' dispatch, which follows, also gives an official account of Lieutenant Colonel Parker's engagement at Vigan:

"General Young, with 13 companies of infantry and 9 troops of cavalry, not heard from since 29th ultimo. He was then about 20 miles south of Vigan and most of troops marching to his support, but then had with him three troops cavalry, battalion Thirty-third infantry and Macabebe scouts. One company Thirty-third infantry sent by boat to Vigan to reinforce navy there. Lieutenant Colonel Parker of Thirty-fifth, reports from Vigan, 5th inst., that he has not heard from Young for a week. Insurgents 800 strong made attack on his force, consisting B company and 152 sick and footsore men Thirty-third infantry, 4 o'clock morning 4th, entering city in darkness; severe street fight ensued, continuing four hours; enemy driven out, leaving 40 dead, 32 prisoners, including many officers, and 84 rifles; now on outskirts entrenching. Parker says can hold out indefinitely; plenty rations and ammunition. His loss eight enlisted men killed, three wounded. One hundred sixty men now being transported from San Fabian to his relief. Young must be in vicinity with large force."

CHICAGO, Dec. 7 .- The Tribune says: According to J. G. Johnson of the Democratic executive committee New York wants the Democratic national convention and will make a strong effort to secure it. His information shows, too, that there is considerable sentiment among party leaders throughout the country in favor of going to that city. They are impressed with the claims of Eastern Democrats that it would be a good move. It is said that only a few of the Westerners 'who will be elected delegates have ever seen New York and for that reason they would like to go there. Furthermore. it is stated that Tammany Hall not only will pay the expenses but contribute a much larger amount to the campaign fund than Milwaukee, Kansas City or any other Western town can afford to

The amount of losses by investors is not known, as all evidence was destroyed before the men left. The authorities are taking steps to apprehend the men.

Bubonic Plague Gaining.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Dec. 7.—Passengers from the west coast of South America report an ominous outlook in connection with the spread of the bubonic plague. There seems little doubt that the epidemic is slowly but surely working westward.

Preparing a Monster Petition. DES MOINES, Dec. 7.-A petition will be presented to the Iowa legislature this winter which is expected to be the largest memorial ever laid before that body, asking the enactment of a compulsory education law for pupils from 6 to 14 years old.

Mines Filling With Water. PRETORIA, Friday, Dec. 1.—The Standard says that Wednesday last Cecil Rhodes' dispatches, intercepted near Kimberley, said that the Debeers mines were filling with water and that Mr. Rhodes estimated the damage at \$50,000 per day.

Fined for Issuing a Pass.

RALEIGH, N. C., Dec. 7.—An opinion has been handed down by the North Carolina supreme court holding the Southern railway liable to the law imposing a fine of \$1,000 for issuing a free pass in this state.
