Settling Cuba.
Under the treaty making the United States the guarantor of peace in Cuba the sole right and duty of this country seem to many to be to maintain orderly government and see to it that the constituted authorities, which the whole world and the Cuban people as well have recognized as legitimate, should be sustained in the discharge of their functions until constitutionally displaced.

Spain understood the Cubans and learned the efficacy of diplomacy and largess as aids to keeping the peace. The rebel leaders had their price, and when the pay was not forthcoming there occurred an "uprising" or "rebellion." With the example of "patriots" of the past before them, the Cubans of today cannot be expected to consider the welfare of the state, especially when the state to them means former factional foes or perhaps former comrades who have grown insolent through office.

To Honor the First Steamboat.
Although the celebration of the centenary of the initial trip of Fulton's pioneer steamboat has been deferred two years beyond the proper date, the event is not to pass without fitting recognition by the maritime world. The international maritime exposition, to open in May, 1907, at Bordeaux, is intended to commemorate the harnessing of steam to the wheels of commerce.

The World's Finances.
The recent action of the Bank of England in suddenly raising its rate of discount from 5 to 6 per cent has created an atmosphere of uneasiness and questioning in financial circles. To pressure from this country the present discomfiture of London is generally attributed.
