King Oscar did not believe in coercing the common people. His own grandfather was a humble country notary in France before he fought with Napoleon.

When the king's son and successor, Crown Prince Gustave, was married to Princess Victoria of Baden in 1881 the father revealed not only his eloquent tongue, but his paternal heart in welcoming home the bridal couple.

It is interesting to note that by this marriage the crown prince brought back to Sweden to sit as queen upon the throne of her fathers a greatgranddaughter of the banished King Gustave IV., who was driven from the kingdom by Bernadotte.

Most Popular Woman In Sweden.

The new king of Sweden, Gustave V., is said to be much less popular than was his father. According to report, he is reticent, sedate, exclusive and undemocratic. This tendency is attributed by some persons to his wife, who belongs to an ancient line of monarchs and holds tenaciously to the doctrine of the divine right of kings and the privileges of her class. Nevertheless, no woman in Sweden is more popular than she. Every year she provides a Christmas tree for the sick poor children in the hospital at Stockholm, going personally to the hospital to see the children. Her many kindnesses to the poor and the afflicted have caused her to be much beloved hroughout the country.

Gustave is forty-nine years old and is not without experience as a ruler. For several months during his father's illness he was regent, ruling both Sweden and Norway. He showed excellent ability. Gustave's popularity has increased considerably since his earlier days, when he was quite unpopular.
