**State News.**

James Flood, the boy who murdered Arthur P. Camden in Minneapolis last week, waived examination and was remanded to the county jail without bail.

During the ten months which the state Pasteur institute has been in operation 159 cases have been treated. Residents of Minnesota receive treatment free at this institution while nonresidents are charged \$100.

James L. Lovering, under federal indictment for using the mails with intent to defraud, pleaded guilty before Judge Page Morris of the United States district court in St. Paul and was fined \$200. Lovering was the publisher of a paper known as Successful Agriculture and started a prize guessing contest to increase its circulation. That brought him under the ban of the law. In view of the fact that his offense was somewhat technical, he was fined the minimum on the one count on which he pleaded guilty, and the two other counts against him were nolledd with the consent of United States District Attorney C. C. Houpt.

S. A. Phillips, now under sentence to serve seven years in state prison on a charge that he embezzled the funds of the Hancock company while acting as its northwestern agent, is accused of misuse of the United States mails in a new indictment returned by the federal grand jury at St. Paul. Phillips is out on bail pending an appeal to the supreme court of the state from the action of the Ramsey county court in the embezzlement case. He was acting as agent in the northwest for the Hancock company, which is operated for the purpose of disposing of the bonds of the New York-Chicago Air Line, and also was representing the St. Paul & Seattle Electric Railway company, and other enterprises. Since his conviction for embezzlement the postal authorities have issued fraud orders against some of the concerns which Phillips was representing, and the new indictment is in connection with that action.

**Republican County Convention.**

A republican county convention for the county of Mille Lacs, state of Minnesota, will be held at the court house in the village of Princeton, on Thursday, June 25, 1908, at 10 o'clock p. m., for the purpose of selecting nine delegates to the republican state convention, to be held on Wednesday, July 1, 1908, at 11 o'clock a. m., at the Auditorium in the city of St. Paul, for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for the following state offices to be voted for at the general election in November, 1908: Governor; Lieutenant Governor; Secretary of State; State Treasurer; Attorney General; Two Railroad and Warehouse Commissioners.

The primaries for the election of delegates to said county convention shall be held in the different election districts of said county on Thursday, the 18th day of June, 1908, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and shall be continued open one hour.

Each election district shall be entitled to one delegate for each 15 votes or major fraction thereof averaged on the vote cast for the republican state officers in 1906. It is recommended that the primaries be held at the usual place of holding elections in each precinct.
