Proceedings of Board of County Commissioners, Milie Lacs County.

Auditor's Office, Milie Lacs County, Minn., Princeton, August 31, 1915.

Board of county commissioners of Milie Lacs county met pursuant to adjournment with Chairman Eckdall presiding and all members of the board present.

The report of the board of audit was submitted to the board, duly examined, approved and ordered published as required by law.

The undersigned board of audit of said Milie Lacs county, met at the office of the county treasurer of said county, on the 27th day of July, 1915, for the purpose of examining and auditing the accounts, books and vouchers of Otto Henschel, treasurer of said county, and to count and ascertain the kind, description and amount of funds in the county treasury and belonging thereto.

Moved and unanimously carried that the county of Milie Lacs purchase one Wallis Full-Lave Gasoline Tractor, Model "D", "Cub", with extension rims, from Hagman Hardware Co. of Milaca at the agreed price of \$1,900, payable in March 1916, and payable out of the road and bridge appropriation for 1916 for the 4th commissioner's district.

On motion a recess was taken until one o'clock p. m.

Board reconvened at one o'clock p. m. with all members present.

In the matter of the W. M. White school petition the board made and adopted the following final order, to-wit:

Whereas, the petition of W. M. White, a freeholder of school district No. 6 in this county, with the approval of the county superintendent endorsed thereon, representing that he is the owner of the lands herein-after described, which are situated in said school district, and that said land adjoins school district No. 8, and asking that his said land may be set off from said district No. 6 to said district No. 8 for the following reasons: "Nearer to district No. 8 by a quarter of a mile; better traveled roads to district No. 8 than to district No. 6," was presented to the county board of this county at a session of said board held on the 13th day of July, 1915, for the action of said board thereon; and

Whereas, it was thereupon ordered by said board that a hearing should be had on said petition at a session of said board commencing on the 31st day of August, 1915, at the county auditor's office in the village of Princeton in said county; and

Whereas, it was further ordered in and by said order that notice of the time and place of such hearing be given by posting a notice of said hearing in three public places in each of the school districts to be affected by said petition, and by serving upon the clerk of each of said school districts, by mail a copy of said notice, at least ten days before the time appointed for such hearing, and by giving two weeks' published notice thereof in the Princeton Union, a duly qualified newspaper printed and published at Princeton in said county, and Whereas, at the said session of said board commencing on said 31st day of August, 1915, proof of the due publication posting and service of said notice of hearing as therein directed and required, more than ten days prior to said last named date, having been made and filed, said petition was publicly read and considered by the board, with everything which was said by said interested parties for or against granting the prayer of the petitioner and being satisfied from all the evidence produced at said hearing that the allegations of said petition are true and said board being of opinion that the prayer of

said petitioner should be granted. It is hereby ordered and determined, that the following described lands owned by him, to-wit: East half of the northwest quarter (1/2 of nw 1/4) of section sixteen (16), township thirty-seven (37), range twenty-seven (27), be and the same are hereby set off from said school district No. 6 to said school district No. 8 and said lands are hereby made a part of said last named school district for all purposes whatever.
