

Clough, president of the State Agricultural Society as a man of undoubted business ability. Farmers in this vicinity are all in good spirits in the expectation of bountiful crops this year. If we could have an old-fashioned crop this year everybody would be happy. A cinnamon trick bear and two Frenchmen amused the small boys in town this morning and raked in a harvest of nickels. The bear seemed to possess more intelligence than his masters. Hon. H. C. Waite, St. Cloud: You Princeton people should feel proud of your creamery. It is the only one I know of that paid a dividend this year. Most of them over our way didn't pay expenses. The severe frost on Sunday night played havoc with early garden truck in this vicinity. Fruit trees in blossom, especially plum trees, are ruined for this year. Such freaks of the weather are enough to make a saint use cuss words. Mike Rice, the good-natured railroad section foreman, has purchased of Keith & Brady the triangular piece of ground between the railroad track and the Elk River road, upon which he proposes to erect a neat little residence for himself. Miss Liff, the Foreston schoolma'am who was arrested at the instance of Joseph Sawyer, for undue severity in punishing one of his children, was acquitted by a jury at that place Tuesday. Chas. Dickey prosecuted, but his heart was not in the case. Milaca correspondence: A superficial census of our town has just been completed as a preliminary of incorporation. It shows the names of about 500 people, and a great many workmen and new families were not counted. Not very bad for Milaca, is it? Princeton may have "enough to answered for," vide the Anoka Herald, but among her business men she never numbered a Pratt, a Morrill, or a Bugbee. The county commissioners were in session last Friday and transacted a grist of business. The petition for the organization of a new town east of Milaca to be known as Borgholm, was acted upon and the day for holding the first town meeting was fixed for May 20, at Chas. Burnhelm's house in section 15. The petition of Benjamin Carter and others for the organization of a new town at the lake was laid over until the next meeting of the board. Fishing Season Opens. The fishing season in Minnesota opened Monday for all varieties of the finny tribe except black bass, and local anglers expect a big season. Excellent fishing may be had in the various lakes of this vicinity, but big and beautiful Mille Laes will undoubtedly be the favorite resort of local rod and reel wielders. No "fish stories" have floated into the Union office as yet, and although the open season is here activities will not commence until the waters of the various lakes and streams recede to the normal stage. No license is required for resident fishermen, but non-resident anglers are required to pay \$1 for the season's privilege. The legal limits include fifteen bass and fifteen wall-eyed pike a day and not more than twenty-five of other varieties of fish, except pickerel, bullheads, and rough fish like suckers, red horse and carp. On these there is no limit. The sale of fish is allowed during open season, except that sale of brook trout and bass is prohibited. Sale of pike from waters stocked by the state game and fish commission is unlawful, and the sale of sunfish, perch, and crappies, from stocked lakes, prohibited at discretion of commission. Size of fish allowed: Pike, fourteen inches in length, or one pound, round weight; lake trout, two pounds round weight, or white-fish, two and one-half pounds round weight; black, grey or Oswego bass nine inches in length; muskallonge, thirty inches in length; other fish except rock bass, sunfish and bullheads, six inches in length. Hereunder appears a list of that which is unlawful: To fish with more than one line. To fish within 100 feet of a fishway, dam, or state fish hatchery. To wantonly waste or destroy fish. To sell fish caught in lakes of Hennepin, Ramsey or St. Louis coun-


