Let Us Be Thankful.

The Russian ruble is nominally worth a trifle more than half a dollar of our money. Reckoned on that basis, bread in Russia is now selling at \$225 a pound, flour at \$250 to \$350 a pound, beef at \$275 to \$300 a pound, pork at \$360 a pound, salt at \$150 a pound, butter at \$1,300 to \$1,600 a pound, cigarettes \$5 to \$6 each, and matches, half of which will not light, at \$50 a box. Army rations cost \$400 to \$500 a day for each man. Apparently the cheapest thing in the country is paper with the ruble mark printed on it. All of which is to be commended to those who are preaching the superiority of the soviet to the republic.—Harvey's Weekly.
