County School Notes.
All the schools in Mille Lacs county are now in session with the exception of districts 46, 25 and the north school in district 3. The latter school will open next Monday morning in a new school building with Miss Elvina Hartman in charge of the third year.
The schedule of teachers' institutes to be conducted in Minnesota by the state department of education this fall was received last week. The week of November 7-11 has been assigned to Mille Lacs county. The meeting will be held in the high school gymnasium, Milaca.
Both the Milaca and Princeton high schools report a heavy increase in enrollment over last year. It is gratifying to see so many of the last year's graduates from the eighth grade classes from the rural schools in the county enrolled in the high schools this year.
Twelve students are enrolled in each of the two teacher training departments in this county, Milaca and Princeton high schools.
The question of whether or not public school teachers come under the provisions of the workmen's compensation act has been asked this office frequently. As far as we can ascertain certain portions of this act applies to teachers engaged in service in the public schools throughout the state. School boards are, however, exempt from carrying compensation insurance as provided under this act for employers other than state and the municipal subdivisions thereof.


