Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State of Minnesota

Submitted by the Legislature at its General Session, 1921, to the People of Minnesota at the General 1922 Election Together with Statements of Purpose and Effect of each

ST. PAUL, MINNESOTA, June 30, 1922. HONORABLE MIKE HOLM, Secretary of State, Capitol.

As required by section 46, General Statutes of the state of Minnesota for the year 1915, I propose an amendment to the constitution of the state of Minnesota by the legislature of 1921 and which are to be submitted to the electors of said state at the general election in 1922.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. ONE Chapter 528, Session Laws of Minnesota for the year 1921, proposes an amendment to section 10 of article 9 of the constitution of said state. Said section now reads as follows: "The credit of the state shall never be given or loaned in aid of any individual, association or corporation."

PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. TWO Chapter 529, Session Laws of Minnesota for the year 1921, proposes an amendment to the constitution of the state of Minnesota by adding a new section to article 9, to be known as section 1A, to read as follows: "Every person, co-partnership, company, or association, however organized, engaged in the business of mining or producing iron ore or other ores in this state, shall pay to the state of Minnesota an ad valorem tax on the production of such ores or other ores, which tax shall be in addition to all other taxes provided by law, said tax to be due and payable from such person, co-partnership, company, joint venture, association, partnership or association, however organized, on or before the first day of January next following the mining or producing thereof. The valuation of such ores shall be ascertained in the manner and method provided by law. Funds derived from the tax herein provided for shall be apportioned; fifty per cent to the state general revenue fund, forty per cent to the permanent school fund and ten per cent to the permanent university fund. The legislature shall by law make the necessary provisions for carrying out the provisions of this section."
