"MEN'S CLUB"

Constitution of the Men's Club. ARTICLE I.

The name of this organization shall be the "MEN'S CLUB". The purpose of this club is to promote the general welfare of its members, morally, mentally, physically or otherwise, in accordance with the intent of its founders of this constitution. To promote physical culture, science, literature and art in all its branches, and the social and educational aspirations of its members.

II.

The home of this club shall be in the parish house of St. Peter Claver church and its meetings shall be held therein. All male persons are eligible to membership of this club who are of good reputation and are over sixteen years of age, the membership being given only after the application has been accepted by the board of directors, and the applicant has paid an enrollment fee of Twenty-five (25) cents. Each member shall be required to pay Twenty-five (25) cents per month as dues to defray the expenses of this club.

III.

The government of this club and the management of its affairs shall be vested in a board of five directors, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the club, for a term of one year and shall hold their respective offices until their successors are elected and qualified.

IV.

The directors shall be elected by the members of the club, at a meeting held on the day of January of each year.

After the election of the members of the board of directors, they shall retire and elect from their number a vice-president, secretary and treasurer. The pastor of St. Peter Claver church shall be ex-officio president of this club.

V.

The officers of this club shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by one and the same person. The board of directors shall have power to make all by-laws for the government of this club.

It is the intention to fit the parish house with athletic apparatus, pool and billiard tables and other games for its members, where they can enjoy the same removed from baneful environments of other clubs. Once each month there is to be "Ladies Night" when the "fair daughters of Eve" will be entertained.
