TO RELIEVE CHOKED CATTLE.—Put upon the creature's head a rope or head halter, and draw the rope over the girth of the horns, or some object, which will raise the animal's nose as high as it can be done while standing upon its feet. Then let two men take a smooth lever or sled stake, and standing one on each side of the animal, press it hard against the throat and carry it gradually down as far as possible, and the obstruction will be carried down into the stomach, and the creature is relieved. [GENERAL ORDERS, NO. 78.]

Application having been made to the War Department of the United States for leave to have each township in the State accredited, as against the enrolling of the militia on the 5th of January, 1864, with the whole number of volunteers that have been mustered into the United States service, whilst being legal residents of such town in anticipation of a favorable answer to our application, and in view of the near approach of the time designated for the commencement of the draft—

It is recommended as follows:

The Board of Supervisors of every town, the Common Council of each city, and the Aldermen of each Ward in each city desiring that their respective districts may receive full credit as above indicated, will forward by mail, or other safe conveyance, to the Department, a full and complete list of all volunteers, who, being legal residents of such town, city or ward, have enlisted or been appointed into the United States service since the making up of the returns in pursuance of General Order No. 42, series of 1862 from this Department. Such lists must show explicitly, as far as possible, the company and regiment in which each volunteer enlisted, and contain an exposition of the number of those who enlisted in the 1st Regiment Mounted Rangers previous to the making up of the returns under General Order No. 42 of last year.

Such list must be verified by the oath of at least one member of the Board of Supervisors, Common Council, or Aldermen, or some person who acted under their direction in which latter case, the same must contain an affidavit by a member of such Board of Supervisors, Common Council, or Aldermen, to the effect that such person had been duly appointed to act by the Board, and is now being furnished, by order of the Commander-in-Chief.

Such list must be filed in this office at the earliest date practicable.

Any town not complying with the foregoing recommendations, may not receive full credit for the whole number of troops which it may now have furnished.
