This colored man says he was formerly free, and working for wages in Maryland, across the eastern branche Hp west fouth in 1857, with a Dr. Lee, for whom he had worked, persuaded by the specious promises of higher pay, going first to Athens, Ga, afterwands to knowville. Tann. where Dr. Lee for a time kept the Knoxville Hotel, and subsequently removing to Jonesboro. Receiving wages at first, he was at length

held and treated as a slave. In the winter of 1863, Dr. Lee hired him out to the rebel Quartermaster at Jonesbore. After remaining there ten months he attempted to escape to the lines of the national army. He got twenty miles away, but was caught and taken back, when this robel Quartermaster took him to Surgeon Wailling, in charge of the robel hospital there, and ordered him to out off his feet and hands, to prevent as be said his attempt to run away again.
