**A CALIFORNIAN IN MINNESOTA.**

His opinion of St. Cloud and the country.

The following letter was written by a brother of Mr. John Owen, of this city, to the San Jose, Cal., Mercury:

St. Cloud, Minn., May 17th, 1866.  
Mr. Mercury:—I had my first day in the land of the Sioux and Chippewas, near the place where the frightful massacre of sixty three was perpetrated. It chills the blood to contemplate the outrages inflicted upon the white settlers, by the infuriated Sioux, during that memorable year.
