

Local Items.

Mr. F. W. Tieman, with three assistants, went out to the Fort Hills on the 3d inst., to burn lime for the Mennonite building to be erected the coming summer. This building will be occupied by Rev. Hurry, and will contain a school room, for Indian children.

Perhaps the most interesting event of the season was the ride Mrs. White and Miss Lammond had on the evening of the 28th ult., from the Cheyenne Mission to the Agency. They went up there to a school entertainment, but that was of small interest compared to the ride, in fact, we have heard very little about it. Mr. Tieman, who drove going up, held the team, a pair of Josh Billings' pets, until the ladies, Mrs. White and Misses Stanton and Lammond were seated in the carriage. Just as he went to get in, the mules started on a run and soon overtook their driver by bringing him in collision with a fence post. About this time Miss Stanton, who saw the course the mules were taking and who knew the surface of the ground, jumped out, sustaining a slight injury of one arm. What the ladies in the carriage were thinking of at this juncture does not clearly appear, certain it is they ran some very narrow risks. In at least two places on the route they took, a variation of two inches one way would have caused a general smash up. Miss Lammond got hold of one line which she held throughout the perilous journey—she made the quickest drive on record from the Cheyenne Mission to the Agency. Probably with a view of getting out of the old ruts, Miss Lammond drove to the north and west of the Apache Mission, ran over a fence post and came to a halt a short distance west of the government barn. Just after passing the post the pole fell, stuck in the ground and broke, causing the carriage to make a leap of about ten feet. The trip was a decided success, if the stopping was somewhat irregular. Mr. Tieman, who had been left behind so unceremoniously, appropriated one of Rev. Beard's horses and started in pursuit, but did not succeed in overtaking them. The excitement and fright of such a ride must have been great, but aside from this little damage done.


