THE PRESS vs. FREEMAN.
The Oklahoma Press Association in session at El Reno last week passed the following resolutions regarding Agent Freeman, of the Osage nation, who recently suppressed the Wah-shah-she News and expelled the editors:

As a rule we do not take occasion to express slighted feelings upon the receipt of a polite request to "stop the paper."

Deputy Marshals Burrell Cox and Bob Rudisill came in Wednesday morning from a ten days trip in the Seminole country, where they went with Marshal Rutherford to attempt the capture of the Christian gang who had gone into the hills and were terrorizing the people.

Judge Stuart has determined that a white citizen of one of these tribes who has taken the oath of allegiance to the United States cannot come into the United States court to prevent the operation of the tribal law against him.

Two special elections have been ordered by Chief Justice on account of candidates receiving the greatest number of votes.

THE VINITA CHIEFTAIN claims all the credit for the election of Sam Mayes to the office of chief of the Cherokees. While we do not think THE CHIEFTAIN is wholly the cause of Mr. Mayes' being successful, we do believe that it was the only newspaper in the Cherokee nation that had any effect on the people in influencing them to support the Downing ticket.

Colonel Ralph, in a recent article in Harpers' Magazine on "Sunny Mississippi" drops into a reminiscence of the beverages of that country, and drifts over to the Indian Territory and describes a picture, the characters of which a great many of our readers will have no difficulty in identifying. He says: "If you are a drinking man, which heaven forefend, you may have 'toddy' in the style that obtains from Virginia to farthestmost Texas and that has been imported to Arkansas, Missouri, and the Indian Territory."

It was on the banks of the Arkansas river, in Indian Territory, that I made the acquaintance of this method of—as a friend of mine would say—"spoiling good liquor." The famous Indian champion, Mr. Boudinot, introduced me to a planter whose two cabins, side by side and joined by a single roof, formed the most picturesque home that I saw on that splendid river. It was introduced as plain "mister," but that would not do down there.

So we children appeared, my mother prepared for each one an especially tempered drink of the same, and, putting—I regret to say—a little more water in mine than the others, because I was the youngest of the children.

Whereas, This Press association has heard with amazement and indignation the outrageous action of the acting Indian agent, Lieutenant-Colonel H. B. Freeman, of the Osage nation, and his villainous treatment of Mr. George B. Tinker, editor of the Wah-shah-she News, of Pawhuska, Oklahoma, wherein said Agent Freeman did suppress and confiscate the Wah-shah-she News, for no other reason than that the said News did justly criticize his official acts; and

Resolved, That we do unambiguously condemn and denounce the actions of Lieutenant-Colonel H. B. Freeman, agent of the Osage nation, in summarily suppressing the Wah-shah-she News and Editor Tinker's rights as a citizen of the Osage nation and of Oklahoma; and be it further
