New Map of Territory.

Among the most recent special maps issued by the United States geological survey is one of the Indian Territory which reveals for the first time the entire area of the little-known country. During the last few years the geographical survey has been pushing topographic work in the territory and has been issuing topographic sheets covering portions of the country as fast as they could be completed. The map now issued, which is on a scale of approximately eight miles to the inch, is 30x32 inches in size; it combines all the main features of the smaller sheets, shows the settlements, boundaries, railroad routes, and drainage, and also gives an excellent idea of the topography or inequalities of relief, by means of contour lines. By this method of expressing relief the mountainous portions of the eastern section are strongly contrasted with the more level country of the remainder of the territory, and the general topographic relations of the whole area appear.

District Attorney Wm. M. Mellette of the Western District, accompanied by his assistant Joseph McCoy, was here Sunday en route to the Sapulpa term of court which begins today.

Commisstone's Court.

George Cook and Leo Thompson, the two men who were arrested August 15th, while peddling some suspiciously stolen shoes, were tried in the commissioner's court Friday afternoon. They were found guilty and sentenced to ten days in jail and fined \$10 each costs, each.

John R. Malden, of Welch, was acquitted on an assault to kill charge. He was accused of having attempted to settle a domestic difficulty by killing his wife. The evidence showed that Malden, at the time of the alleged assault, was mentally unbalanced, and as his condition is no longer considered dangerous he was released.

About the Osages.

The Osage Indians are reported to be the richest people in the world per capita. There are in all 884 full-blooded Osages and 940 mixed-blood. They have a fund to their credit, derived from the sale of lands to Kansas, amounting to \$3,281,143, and an annual interest on that amount which is \$113,357. There is also collected from the rentals \$138,296, and \$60,120 from treaty obligation funds, and \$8,945 from permits. There is a debt of \$400,000 on the nation. This makes a total above the indebtedness of \$8,400,841, counting one year's income to their credit, or an average of \$4,363 per capita. In addition to this there are one and one-half million acres of land to be divided among the 1824 members of the tribe. The Osage country is fifty-one miles long by fifty-eight miles wide.

Notice is hereby given to the Cherokee Nation that the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes will, at any time prior to the first day of December, 1902, receive and consider the complaint or grievance which any citizen may desire to present concerning the classification placed upon lands of that tribe which he desires to select as an allotment. Such complaint must be made under oath before an officer having a seal, must describe the land in question, must show that allotment desires to select the same in allotment for himself or those whom he lawfully represents and indicate in what particulars the classification heretofore made should be modified. No complaint received after the 30th day of November, 1902, will be considered, and thereafter the classification of lands will be declared fixed and final, and not subject to change from any cause.

A meeting of the Indian Territory Improved Cattle Breeder's Association has been called by President Campbell Russell to meet at Prairie Park Stock Farm Monday November 10th. The association was organized last April and has a large number of the leading stock men of the territory on its rolls.

Cut in Colonist Rates.

The action of the Katy in making a special round-trip rate for home-seekers of \$15 to southern Texas points, effective October 21 and 25, has been met by other St. Louis lines leading to the Southwest--the St. Louis and San Francisco; St. Louis, Iron Mountain and Southern; St. Louis and Southwestern. These tickets will be good to all points on the Texas and Pacific, International and Great Northern, Cotton Belt, Texas Midland, Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe, Port Arthur Route, Frisco System and Red River, Texas and Southern, east of Fort Worth and San Antonio; also, to home-seekers' points in Louisiana and Arkansas. The tickets will bear a final limit of thirty days from date of sale and stop over will be permitted within these limits in home-seekers' territory, either going or returning. This action of the railroads is expected to induce a tremendous tide of travel this way.

Early in the afternoon young Garrett went to the drug store and bought a small quantity of medicine, also ten cents' worth of strychnine, saying that he wanted to kill some cats. He went home and soon called to one of the neighbors, saying that he believed he had been poisoned. Physicians were summoned but no relief could be given. His friends believe he took the poison through mistake. The funeral was held from the Presbyterian church Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock, Rev. Allen conducting the services. Sim Garrett was a whole-hearted, generous young man, kind and affectionate to his brothers and sisters; a helpmate to his father.
