UNMINISTEPAL DISCIPLINE.

Gentle Leader of Men Became a Compeller of Mildness in an Untutty Bull.

Rev. Elijah Kellogg was a most unconventional minister. There are many stories of his daring on sea and land. So undaunted was he that his influence over sailors and other men of adventurous life was very great, says Youth's Companion.
