TEMPORARY MAIL SERVICE (TER. OF OKLAHOMA.)

Sealed proposals for carrying the United States Mails from Wright Okla. to Langston Okla., eight miles and back, twice a week, from July 1st, 1893, to June, 1894, by a schedule of 2 hours running time each way, as follows: Leave; Wright Tuesday and Saturday at 10 a. m.; arrive at Langston by 12; m; Leave Langston by 1; p. m.; arrive at Wright by 3; p. m; Will be received by the Postmaster at Langston Okla., until Nov. 30th, 1892 inclusive.

In all cases the rate per annum should be stated in proposal, regardless of the period of service.

A contract, with sureties, certified to by the Postmaster to be good and sufficient, is required to be executed by the accepted bidder, and persons bidding must be honest, and capable, and not less than twenty one years old. Bids from postmasters or persons employed in post offices cannot be accepted.
