"LOOK BEFORE YOU LEAP."

When we say no Bonds, we do not say it just to oppose and contrary the school board and some others who say Bonds, but, because Bonds will ruin us. Will heap up our taxes, and put our property, our homes into the control and possession of the tax gatherer, and money lender, war rent speculator for the time the Bonds are to run, and then too, will put us into the hands of the shaver, the discounter, and the corrupt under cover robber, now let us prove this then you will believe! let go into any school district of Logan Co., or elsewhere that the people have been deceived and led into voting Bonds upon themselves, and they will come to you the day of their calamity and they have made under drags of every school board that led, and looked them into it. Have you not the good sense and will you not protect your experience? 2 "In Logan Co., as you know the people have been led from Jimbo to hell in this bond business and today you have a bonded and county indebtedness hanging over you in the sum of \$158,000, will you, however, hear with you never see, and will you license this monster to begin gnawing at your heart string and home. Let us show you by figures and facts how this bond business goes. The statistics of Oklahoma say you may vote bonds, not that you must, and that when you have done so you must sell them at par that is dollar for dollar. Now, do they do it, no. If not why not and how do they keep from doing what the law says they should? Well, Read in Logan Co., a bond of \$30,000 was ordered. The money sharks had bought Logan Co. warrants of her officers, of witnesses in criminal cases, of jurors, and sundry others at a discount of 40 per cent that is for a dollar in warrant they gave 60 c in money. Thus robbing the poor individual of 40 cent of his much needed money. Now, watch how this works. Bonds are then offered for sale, here the whole people are robbed. The money monger takes this warrant he paid 60 cent for, and buys a dollar in bonds with it and, also, 7 per cent interest is counted on the warrant and he gets 7 per cent more in interest on the bond. Now look 7 per cent interest on the warrant, he make off of us, we have it to pay, then the 40 per cent discount made off of the individual, plus the 7 per cent interest make 47 per cent then add the 7 per cent interest on the bond, which we must pay and which he gets and you have 47 cent plus 7 cts-54 cts, he has made on every dollar worth of bonds he buys. Is this all? Oh, no! what next? Well, then the bonds must be sold, who is there to buy them? can we do it? No, who then this same robber, the statistics says he must pay dollar for dollar for them what does he add the bond seller do for the people, and here is where the robbery comes in. The money sharks say I want take them, the sellers says we can't sell them any lower. Then they come together and all of them go in the robbing business. How? why. They now say we must sell these bonds. But we can't do it ourselves, so we will get some one to sell them and pay him a commission of 25 per cent. The shaver tells his agreement to the money shark and says pay the dollar for dollar price in these warrants for which you gave only 46 cts on the dollar, and then I and the school board, or as it may chance to be, will whack this 25 per cent commission with you. He says all right and takes the bonds making about 15 per cent more on the dollar and this plus 54 per cent makes 69 cts he takes and gives us 31 cts less the remaining 10 cts on the dollar that the board and commission men gets. The Bonds too are sold not dollar for dollar as the law says but a dollar in bonds is sold actually for 76 cts, not in money either, but in the outstanding warrants as above described, now can you see, and who has to pay all this robbery

and steal in the end, why they simply say to us just take 5 or 10 years on a bond to us and pay us 7 per cent interest on it, increase your tax levy and it is all right. We will fold our arms and wait and they ought to wait. Taxes and death are certain, with these bonds and death is certain. But we forget to tell you that in these \$30,000 worth of bonds sold for Logan Co., this same kind of a gang took us, the people, \$12,000 and they got it in the way we have told you. Now, it must not be forgotten that these influences, have in all probability found their way to some members of our school board, for we have it that Mr. D. J. Wallace the secretary of our board has told a certain individual that there was \$100,00 in it for him if he would assist and succeed in getting the people to vote these abominable bonds, and for the other reason that he would hire Rev. A. E. Young, to carry the petition around on Sunday, and would himself go from house to house on Sunday drumming for them. Then too we are informed that under the circumstances T. S. T. or Mr. E. Robinson does not join with the Director Mr. S. G. Garrett and Secy D. J. Wallace in this thing, now, this is no Ayers fight, no Cox fight, no strike on gang, but the fight of us all to save our homes. We will tell you more in next issue.
