

COMMERCIAL.

HONOLULU, OCT. 20, 1908.

The steamer Minnie arrived this morning, bringing San Francisco dates to the 17th inst. The bark Comet sailed on the 24 with a full cargo of merchandise and the mails, but owing to light winds has not yet arrived.

The D.C. Murray arrived at San Francisco on the 6th inst., twenty days from this port. Her cargo of sugar was disposed of at once.

The steamer H. B. Smith, which made an unusually long passage over 42 days, found the sugar market favorable. Her cargo was disposed of on the 20th inst., at the following prices: Princeville No. 1, 1 1/2c, No. 2, 1 1/4c; Orono No. 1, 1 1/2c, No. 2, 1 1/4c; Wailuku No. 1, 1 1/2c.

The fresh trade blowing brings in several Arctic whalers to-day, whose reports are more encouraging than those previously received.

The D.C. Murray was to leave on the 17th and will be due about the 20th, bringing our next mails.

The schooner Alaska, which sailed from this port on the 16th of August for Portland, had not arrived at that date. Unusual fogs and light variable winds are no doubt the reasons of so long a passage.

We learn by the San Francisco papers that the British ship Loch-n-garry, run ashore at the Navigator Islands and became a total loss. She was on her way to England with a cargo of 1,500 tons of goods.

From reports received we hear of the loss of the whaler ship Curlew, August 1st, on Blossom's Shoal, north of Ice Cape, in the Arctic Ocean. The vessel had taken thirteen whales, at the time she was lost.

More about the Sugar Fraud.

We insert the following communication from the San Francisco, received by the Montana. The matter in dispute does not concern our planters here, further than sympathy with the American Company which has been the purchaser of their produce.

A curious phase in the case of the Idaho's cargo of sugar, seized at San Francisco (because 2,000 bags of light sugar had been fraudulently darkened), has come up.

The sugar, consisting of a three refiners' merchant, and a broker. They agreed it at 54 cents per lb. in bond. It was proved that the 2,000 bags of sugar had not been darkened at all, they would have been worth 75 cents in bond in San Francisco, for grocery use.

The sugar company's contract with the Hawaiian planters for certain portions of their crop, long known in our community for the richness and compass of her voice, and was considered the best Hawaiian singer here.
