The Black Sea. The following remarkable article in the Government Messenger of St. Petersburg gives the official Russian account of the settlement of the Black Sea question.

The Imperial Cabinet notified to Europe by the Imperial Chancellor's circular of the 10th of October that it no longer considered itself bound by the restrictions relating to the Black Sea, and that his majesty the Emperor had resumed his full sovereign rights upon that sea, leaving at the same time the other sovereigns free to resume their rights in their entire extent.

While securing the dignity of Russia, the labors of the Conference were greatly impeded and delayed by the contemporary political events; but from the very beginning all the Powers expressed a readiness to solve the questions in a spirit of peace and justice.

The new steamer Oceanic, Captain Dight Murray, arrived at this port, late on Tuesday night, and steamed up to her dock early yesterday morning with the American ensign at her foremast head, and the British flag at the peak.

She excited much attention among the thousands who crossed on the ferry boats during the day. Since the Great Eastern left these waters nothing has been seen to rival the Oceanic in size.
