

LATEST FOREIGN NEWS.

Per R. M. S. Marara. Dates to July 3rd, AMERICAN.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 3.—A report was current among certain shipwrights last night that a dispatch had been received by the owner of the Marara that upon the arrival of the steamer at Auckland a riot had occurred.

CHICAGO, July 2.—The most important action by labor organizations of the city against the anarchists since the Haymarket riot was taken by District Assembly 24 of the Knights of Labor to-night.

WASHINGTON, July 2.—There is ample indication that the Democrats will put on a full force of men for the Congressional election at all places where the Government employs laborers and artisans.

NEW LONDON, July 2.—The eleventh in the annual series of four-mile, eight-oared, straight-away races inaugurated between Yale and Harvard in 1876 was rowed this evening on the Thames-river course.

CHICAGO, July 2.—It is expected that Miss Cleveland will arrive in Chicago within the next few weeks to enter upon her duties as editress of Literary Life.

HALIFAX, July 2.—A telegram from Shelburne, N. S., to-night states that the Dominion cruiser Terror this afternoon formally seized the Portland fishing schooner City Point, which was forcibly detained at Shelburne yesterday for an alleged violation of the fisheries treaty.

NEW LONDON (Conn.), July 1.—The race between the Freshman crews of Harvard, Columbia and Yale was won by Harvard this morning, who finished in 10:53, Columbia making the two miles in 11:34. Yale upset, leaving her out of the contest.

Beach, Ross, Parkins (Teemer, Bubeat, Kemp and Mathewson have entered for the open sculling competition in England.

English and European.

LONDON, July 2.—Returns up to 1 A. M. show the election of 38 Tories, 30 Gladstonians, 13 Unionists and 9 Parnellites. The results of yesterday's elections indicate nothing clearly except the close nature of the contest.

The only Scotch election was in Perth, which returned a Gladstonian by a small majority. Three London divisions—East Paddington, North Paddington and the Strand—have given immense Unionist majorities, returning, respectively, Lord Randolph Churchill, L. L. Cobain and W. H. Smith.

LONDON, July 2.—Gladstone is re-elected for Midlothian. Up to 1 o'clock this afternoon twenty-two Tories, nine Unionists, twelve Liberals and three Parnellites have been elected.

LONDON, July 2.—The English cutter yacht Galatea passed Lizard Point to-day, bound for Boston Mass.

The Queen to-day reviewed the troops at Aldershot. The weather was bright and clear and the town was crowded. Among those present during the review were the Prince and Princess of Wales.

The Watrous spinning mills at Kidderminster were burned to-day. The loss is \$500,000. A thousand persons are thrown out of employment.

As the result of a collision yesterday near Warzob, seven persons lost their lives, ten of whom were crushed beyond recognition.

Temps and Bega rivers, in Hungary, have again risen, flooding the surrounding country. Two villages have been destroyed by floods.

Cholera is greatly increasing in Brindisi and surrounding villages.

The Panama Canal Committee at Paris to-day examined three of the Ministers and M. Roussseau. They all urged the Government to sanction the proposed Panama Canal loan.

LONDON, July 1.—At Newcastle to-day the North Derby for three-year-olds was won by D. Perkins' bay colt Hawkeye, Lord Hasting's bay Steaton second, Sir R. Jardine's chestnut filly Daydream third.

Advices from Belgrade say that the Servian peasantry generally are rioting. They refuse to pay taxes levied since the unsuccessful war against Bulgaria, and ill-treat the tax collectors.

The "Mariposa" Accident.

The U. S. Government Inspectors of Boilers at San Francisco, filed with the Supervising Inspector, June 29th, the following report of their investigation of the fatal accident last February aboard the steamer Mariposa.

"We have to report that at about 10:15 o'clock A. M. February 14th last, while the Oceanic Company's steamer Mariposa was stopped outside the port of Honolulu to discharge pilot, the forward tube-sheet of middle combustion chamber in the after-port boiler buckled to such an extent that eighteen tubes were drawn out from the tube-sheet, causing an escape of steam and hot water, whereby three men were fatally hurt—two of them being found dead in the fire-room, shortly after the accident.

"After making examination, and taking into consideration the evidence given by the Chief Engineer, his assistants and those in the fire-room, who have testified in this case, we have to conclude that the accident in the after-port boiler was caused by the continued expansion and contraction of the furnace-flue and flue-sheet and tubes.

"Under the foregoing testimony and facts in this case, we cannot attach any blame to the Chief Engineer or his assistants in connection with the accident to the after-port boiler on the steamer Mariposa, February 14th last."

An American Whaleship in Trouble.

On the 17th of June, at the request of Captain Webb, United States Consul at Auckland, the Governor caused a warrant to issue for the apprehension of the captain and first and second mates, in consequence of the character of the evidence brought out at the Consular inquiry.

Take an agate iron or porcelain lined saucepan, and pour into it one part of Taro Flour to two parts of water. Mix well and be sure there are no lumps. Place the saucepan over a good fire and stir the Flour and water with a wooden spoon or stick until it becomes thick, which will take from three to five minutes, according to heat employed.

Should the Poi show a tendency to become cloggy or lumpy, it can easily be remedied by straining it through a piece of netting into a pan or bowl, and smoothing it down either with a potato masher or wooden spoon.

Persons preferring sweet Poi will find that by cooking the Flour according to the above instructions while preparing their evening meal, and letting it stand overnight, it will be in proper condition for use on the following morning.
