EDITORIAL.

There have been during the past year spasmodic efforts made, both here and on the Coast, to decry the policy of Hawaii in going to England after capital for public and private enterprises.

Mr. B. F. Dillingham, the chief promoter of the colonization scheme now seeking means in London, has given us a newspaper clipping sent him by Colonel Rabbitt, a cousin of his own, in Wyoming Territory.

Let us have all the English capital that can be procured on favorable terms for internal development. It will benefit not the least the American capitalists who have large stakes in this country.

The Supreme Court, in their opinion on the veto, remark that they do not apprehend such serious results as counsel for plaintiff anticipated from the prerogative being upheld.

Under the former administration, what has been seen in this regard is the Ministry chiming in with measures initiated by the best minds on the Opposition side, when such were seen to catch the unbiased intelligence of a majority of the house, but, for no apparent object but to do despite to political opponents, securing the King's dissent from those measures.

doubtless could be cited, as well as the evidence of the late Mr. Gibson to an interviewer in San Francisco, prove that the King had recognized even under the old Constitution—without a provision like that of Article 78 in the new one—that it would be an unwarranted stretch of prerogative for him to give his assent to bills or withhold it therefrom without availing himself of the advice and consent of his constitutional advisers.

Coming to the results of an irresponsible veto at the outset of the new regime, they are found to be altogether subversive of the principles of responsible, representative government.

There is no fact more patent in the community than that the King, while claiming the right of veto independent of his constitutional advisers, acted in some cases entirely on the advice of persons having neither position nor responsibility in the state, whom the electorate would have none of, either as representatives or men of counsel in affairs.

from Russia. The situation must not be judged from press comments. The Russian newspapers I do not believe. I believe the Czar's word absolutely. The situation on the whole is not different from that of 1879. I grant that the concentration of Russian troops on the frontier may appear serious, but I perceive no cause or pretext for a Russian or European war.

Bismarck then proceeded to review the relations between Prussia and Russia since 1848, and showed how frequently they had assumed a menacing aspect. He said that all times calmness to conscientiousness was displayed by Ministers on the Prussian side toward the threatening position of Russian affairs, the position of which foreign countries had not an idea, and succeeded in averting mischief.

To effect this purpose no sacrifice must or can be too heavy. The warlike tendencies of France and Russia drive us to defense. We are better able than any other nation to offer a strong resistance to our foes.

The strength we possess will assure public opinion and the nervousness of bourse and press. Our task is to strengthen this strength. We must, of course, have the best of weapons for the service under the present bills, with the aid of which we shall be able to place a million food soldiers on each of our frontiers.

With regard to Bulgaria we have remained perfectly consistent. Russia certainly has every reason to feel grateful for the loyal attitude of Germany to the Bulgarian question.
