NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The owner of an electric railway at Brighton, England, has constructed an electrically driven dogcart. Although it is a slow goer and a poor climber, there is no knowing to what the idea may lead.

There has been an unusually large amount of snow in the North of England this season. Some copies of the Paradise of the Pacific should be sent there, inviting all the north-countrymen who have the means to come in out of the cold next winter.

In an interview cabled from Florence, Mr. Blaine expresses his conviction of a Republican victory, based particularly on the tariff question. Other American authorities, however, hold that the tariff issue will change votes from either side to the other about evenly, thus leaving the strength of the two parties approximately the same as before.

A THREE-YEAR-OLD horse—"Bell Boy"—was sold by Senator Stockbridge of Michigan last month to a company at Frankfort, Kentucky, for \$35,000. The Senator alone named bought the colt for Senator Stanford of California for \$5,000. It is said that the price obtained by Stockbridge is the highest ever paid for a three-year-old. There seems to be money in the right kind of horses.

Mr. BLAINE'S reasons for withdrawing from the Presidential candidacy are, briefly, his conviction that any man whose name is associated with defeat should not for his party's sake allow himself to be renominated, and that his strength is not equal for the hard work he would feel incumbent on him in the campaign, while his wife and family would regard with horror his exposure again to the deluge of partisan abuse and detraction.

The Wesleyan Conference of New South Wales has resolved to maintain its ground in Tonga, where its followers have been hotly persecuted during the past year. This persecution was in consequence of an attempt made to murder the Premier, Rev. Shirley Baker, whose policy and King George's it was to establish a state church and compel conformity thereto. Sir Charles Mitchell, the Imperial High Commissioner sent to Tonga to report on the troubles, has, however, secured a promise of amnesty for prisoners and the proclamation of religious toleration. Rev. Mr. Moulton, who led the Wesleyan cause throughout the troublous period, is appointed by the New South Wales Conference to return, notwithstanding that it was the opinion of some of the oldest and best informed members that a wiser course would be to send a new man, who would be less likely to revive feelings of resentment in the heart of the King and his state church party.
