THE DEAD EMPEROR.

The body of the late Emperor William lay in state in the Cathedral. It was dressed in the uniform of the First Regiment of the Guards.

A Berlin dispatch of March 10th said a countless crowd surrounded the palace. There was nothing for them to see, but to heavy hearts it seemed a consolation to be near the house.

Prince Bismarck went alone to the presence of the dead and reverently kissed the forehead. There was no possibility of doubting the depth of the Chancellor's affections for the Master, as he loved to call the old Emperor.

Few additional details are given of the death scene, but there is one notable incident vouched for regarding the Emperor's last recognition of his family.

Berlin advices of the 10th contain the following: Court interest is becoming centered in the question of the coronation and of the position of the new Emperor toward Prince William.

The English court is in deep mourning. The bereavement is simply disastrous to the social season.

By the death of Emperor William, Queen Victoria becomes the oldest European reigning sovereign. There is only one ruler who has kept his jubilee, the Emperor of Brazil.

The Queen, the Duke of Albany, Princess Beatrice and Prince Henry of Battenberg, all attired in deep mourning, drove to Marlborough House, March 11th, to greet the Prince and Princess of Wales on their silver wedding-day.

Messages of condolence were sent to the Imperial family from President Carnot of France, the sovereigns of Europe, the Pope, the Sultan of Turkey, and President Cleveland of the United States.

RANDALL'S TARIFF BILL.

He characterized their speeches against Union soldiers as a bid to get the Confederate votes. He assailed the Southern Senators for their present opposition to all pension legislation.
