The jury disagreed last term. A. Rosa for plaintiff; V. V. Ashford and C. Creighton for defendant. The trial was still on when the Court adjourned at 4:05 to 10 o'clock next morning.

Verdict of Three Hundred Dollars for Colburn—Matters Heard at Chambers.
In the case of Marcus A. Colburn vs. Richard Cayford, Mr. Ashford addressed the jury for the defendant at 2:35 p. m. Friday. Mr. Rosa followed at 3:30 for the plaintiff. Mr. Justice Dole began his charge at 3:50. He said the matter was fortunately narrowed by the admission that mal-treatment had killed the horse. The only question was one of fact, whether the defendant had performed the fatal part of the treatment. Interest might be allowed in case of damages being found, but the verdict could not be for more than \$300. At 4:10 the jury retired, returning ten minutes later with a verdict of \$300 for the plaintiff, three jurors dissenting. Mr. Creighton noted exceptions to the verdict as being contrary to the law and the evidence, damages being excessive, and gave notice of motion for a new trial.

When the jury retired the divorce case of Kamaui (K.) vs. Waiwalea (W.) was begun. W. C. Achi for the plaintiff; no counsel for defendant.

The April term's last session was held on Saturday. Motions for new trials were refused in Joliva vs. Kaulukou and Colburn vs. Cayford, exceptions to the decision being noted in each case.

F. Blackburn pleaded guilty to fast driving in his appeal from conviction in the Police Court. He wished to withdraw his plea later but was not allowed, whereupon he noted exceptions. All untried criminal cases were continued to the July term. The Court adjourned sine die at 12:30 p. m.

Mr. Creighton noted exceptions to the verdict as being contrary to the law and the evidence, damages being excessive, and gave notice of motion for a new trial.

Before Chief Justice Judd, the petition of W. H. Cummings, guardian of W. C. Cummings, a minor, for license to sell real estate, was partly heard and continued—W. C. Achi, attorney, and the petitioner in person appearing. The Honolulu—In question is a parcel of land at Wailuku, containing an area of 562-100 acres.

A Horse Doctor Case on Second Trial—Progress Made in Appeal Term.
The second trial of Marcus A. Colburn vs. Richard Cayford began before the following mixed jury at the April term on Thursday: W. B. Rice, John Kuanana, J. Paakana, J. Uayahuena, Albert Trask, J. U. Kapuhini, E. A. Melneyn, Godfrey Brown, J. K. Wilder, O. Branch, R. W. Cathcart, and F. Allen. It is an action of tort, damages \$300, for the loss of a horse defendant was treating for plaintiff. The jury disagreed last term. A. Rosa for plaintiff; V. V. Ashford and C. Creighton for defendant. The trial was still on when the Court adjourned at 4:05 to 10 o'clock next morning.

Chief Justice Judd presided at the monthly appeal term at Chambers, and the calendar was called with the following results:

Eleven cases were continued.

Verdict of Three Hundred Dollars for Colburn—Matters Heard at Chambers.
In the case of Marcus A. Colburn vs. Richard Cayford, Mr. Ashford addressed the jury for the defendant at 2:35 p. m. Friday. Mr. Rosa followed at 3:30 for the plaintiff. Mr. Justice Dole began his charge at 3:50. He said the matter was fortunately narrowed by the admission that mal-treatment had killed the horse. The only question was one of fact, whether the defendant had performed the fatal part of the treatment. Interest might be allowed in case of damages being found, but the verdict could not be for more than \$300. At 4:10 the jury retired, returning ten minutes later with a verdict of \$300 for the plaintiff, three jurors dissenting. Mr. Creighton noted exceptions to the verdict as being contrary to the law and the evidence, damages being excessive, and gave notice of motion for a new trial.

When the jury retired the divorce case of Kamaui (K.) vs. Waiwalea (W.) was begun. W. C. Achi for the plaintiff; no counsel for defendant.

J. M. Monsarrat vs. A. H. Loo Ngawk et al. Bill to quiet title and injunction. A. S. Hartwell for plaintiff; Neumann and Brown for defendant. A demurrer was argued and submitted before Mr. Justice Preston.

Kaleiali (K.) vs. Kekuawela (K.) Trover. Defendant's appeal from the Police Court of Honolulu, where on March 29, 1889, judgment was rendered for plaintiff for damages \$140 and costs \$3.65, in all \$143.65. The Chief Justice heard the above case continued from Thursday. A. P. Peterson for plaintiff; W. O. Smith for defendant. The Court gave judgment for plaintiff for \$100, and, as judgment of lower court was reduced over one-fifth, ordered that plaintiff pay costs. Plaintiff noted an appeal pro forma to a jury.

AT CHAMBERS.
Chief Justice Judd granted petition of S. M. Damon, guardian of Helen A. Dickson, for approval of accounts and his discharge. The grounds of petition were that W. F. Allen had been appointed guardian of the minor under the will of Mrs. Laura F. Dickson, and to him petitioner had paid without deduction the amount of a legacy, \$1,853.53, under the will of Mrs. Catherine Bates of Cincinnati.

Close of the April Term—Criminal Cases Over to July.
The April term's last session was held on Saturday. Motions for new trials were refused in Joliva vs. Kaulukou and Colburn vs. Cayford, exceptions to the decision being noted in each case.

F. Blackburn pleaded guilty to fast driving in his appeal from conviction in the Police Court. He wished to withdraw his plea later but was not allowed, whereupon he noted exceptions. All untried criminal cases were continued to the July term. The Court adjourned sine die at 12:30 p. m.
