SHIPPING NOTES.

The W. S. Bowne came off the Marine Railway Friday afternoon.

The brig W. G. Irwin came off the Marine Railway on Thursday morning. The W. S. Bowne went on the same day for repairs.

The whaler Alexander, Capt. Showrey, which was cruising around off port a couple of days, has departed for the North Seas.

The American brigantine Consuelo, Capt. Robertson, sailed from Kahului January 15th for San Francisco with sugar.

The barkentine Wrester, Capt. Dwyer, arrived at Kahului, Maui, January 13th, 54 days from Newcastle, N S W, with 848 tons of coal.

The R. M. S. Mariposa took to San Francisco January 11th, 4,083 boxes sugar, 1,894 bchs. bananas, and 34 bags betel leaves, valued at \$41,130.

The brigantine W. G. Irwin, Captain McCulloch, sails for San Francisco on Sunday morning at 10 o'clock, with a full load of sugar from this port.

The tern W. S. Bowne which came off the Marine Railway Saturday, left this port the same day for Mahukona, Hawaii, to take sugar for San Francisco.

The C. R. Bishop brought on Wednesday 529 bags rice, 475 bags rice, 310 bags paddy, 100 sacks rice bran, 243 bchs. bananas, 11 hides, and 50 pgs. sundries.

The brigantine W. G. Irwin, Capt. J. E. McCulloch, sailed for San Francisco Sunday morning with about 5,000 bags sugar and 3,000 bags rice, also a deck load of bananas.

The American ship Merom, Captain Glover, arrived at this port on Tuesday, 62 days from Newcastle, N. S. W., with 1,790 tons of coal for Messrs. Wilder & Co. The Merom is anchored in the stream.

The German iron bark H. Hackfeld, Captain Wohlmut, arrived at this port on Wednesday, 138 days from Liverpool, with a cargo of general merchandise consigned to Messrs. Hackfeld & Co. She is docked at Brewer's wharf.

The S. S. Australia sailed on Friday the 17th at noon, with 11,333 bags sugar, 4,410 bags rice, 100 bags coffee, 752 bds green hides, 2 bds sheepskins, 17 bds goat skins, 7,942 bchs bananas, 107 empty beer casks, 13 bxs betel leaves, 4 bbs, 1 coop of chickens, 11 bxs fruit, 1 box of jewellers' sweepings. Capt. H. G. Morse.

A San Francisco paper recently published the following sketch of Capt. H. G. Morse, who arrived last week with his vessel, the Alameda, from San Francisco en route to the Colonies. It will be interesting to his many friends:

"Captain H. G. Morse, of the R. M. S. Alameda, is one of the oldest, most popular, and most successful sea captains who enter the port of San Francisco. Born in the State of Massachusetts in 1832, he began his seafaring career in April, 1842. For five years of his life he was in the pepper trade to the west coast of Sumatra. In 1853 he was raised to the position of captain, and for the nine succeeding years he commanded four traders to the east coast of Siberia. Then began a stirring period of six years for him as commander of American clipper ships, trading around the Horn from Boston to San Francisco. These were the days before railroads crossed the continent and when the bulk of the commerce of the Pacific States was carried around the Horn in the famous clippers of the period. In this trade Captain Morse made some famous runs, and gained high renown. In 1868 he entered the service of a California steamship company, and he has since that period commanded sixteen different vessels, trading to China, British Columbia, the Sandwich Islands and Australia. During all this period of active service, in which he has faced many a storm and braved many a danger, Captain Morse has never lost a ship or met with any serious mishap. The captain is highly popular wherever he is known. As a commander he uses great tact and judgment, and his good humor and genial manners make him exceedingly popular with the traveling public. The captain is in the prime of life, and the chances are that he will see many years more of active service."
