PLANTERS' CONVENTION.

Annual Meeting of the Planters' Labor and Supply Company. FOURTH DAY.

The meeting came to order Thursday morning, at 9:40 o'clock. Present—J. F. Hackfeld, T. R. Walker, H. P. Baldwin, P. C. Jones, G. Renton, J. R. Renton, W. R. Castle, G. N. Wilcox, E. C. Bond, W. O. Smith, J. B. Atherton and C. R. Bishop.

The minutes of the preceding day were read and approved. The bill drafted by the Committee on Labor was presented to the meeting.

Messrs. Castle and Smith discussed at length the advisability of making any use of the United Chinese Society.

Mr. Castle stated he had no objection, but a member of the committee had thought it preferable to leave it to the discretion of the Minister.
