

SUPREME COURT--OCTOBER TERM.

IN BANCO--BEFORE THE FULL COURT. MONDAY, Oct. 20.

In the matter of the petition of T. May, M. P. Robinson, H. W. Mist, Geo. S. Harris and T. R. Walker, petition for a writ of mandamus against the Right Rev. Alfred Willis, Bishop of the Anglican Church in Hawaii.

The King vs. Sin Fook; exceptions from Fourth Circuit. F. M. Hatch for defendant. Argued and decision reserved.

BEFORE JUDGE, C. J.

TUESDAY, Oct. 21.

The King vs. F. Turrill and J. M. Vivas. Breach of election laws. Appeal from Police Court of Honolulu. Nolle prosequi entered.

The King vs. James Quail. Opium importing. Tried before a foreign jury, who return a verdict of guilty. Sentenced to be imprisoned at hard labor for three months and pay a fine of \$100.

The King vs. Arthur Johnstone. Libel. Tried before the following jury: H. F. Wichman, H. R. Hitchcock, T. W. Lishman, B. J. Fagerroos, R. J. Greene, H. Lose, C. W. Zeigler, W. Templeton, E. S. Cunha, J. L. Torbert, C. Bosse, Z. K. Meyers. The jury returned a verdict of guilty in the second degree, two dissenting. The Court defers sentence to Wednesday morning.

WEDNESDAY, Oct. 22d.

The King vs. Arthur Johnstone. Libel. The defendant, who was found guilty in the second degree, was sentenced to pay a fine of \$200 and costs.

The King vs. Lau Yuen. Receiving stolen goods. Tried before a foreign jury, who returned a verdict of acquittal.

M. A. Gonsalves vs. C. L. Brito et al. Case. Tried before a foreign jury. Still on.

M. A. Gonsalves vs. C. L. Brito et al. Case. Continued from the 22d. Tried before a foreign jury, who returned a verdict for plaintiff for \$3,000. F. M. Hatch, for plaintiff; A. Ross, for defendant.

Government Land and Lease Sale.

At noon, Oct. 23d Auctioneer Hasseger, under the fatherly eye of the Minister of the Interior, sold at public auction at the front entrance of Aliiolani Hale, 268 acres, a little more or less, of grazing land at Kamehameki and Pulehuiki, Kula, Maui, to Hon. J. T. Baker for \$2,850.

The lease of the Government lands of Kawala, Aemaloo, Poupouwela, Kaunamano, Papaikou, 1, 2 and 3, in the district of Kan, Hawaii, containing an area of 2,700 acres was sold to the Hutchinson Plantation Company at the upset price, \$600 per annum.

The lease of the land known as Hionaa, district of Kan, Hawaii, containing an area of 1,332 acres, was also bought by the Hutchinson Plantation Company at the upset price, \$150 per annum.

W. C. T. U.--Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the W. C. T. U. was held Wednesday night in the parlors of the Central Union Church, Mrs. Dr. J. M. Whitney, the President, in the chair.

Mrs. R. J. Greene, the Secretary, read a lengthy report on the society's doings during the year. Though not much had been accomplished, yet the society had not been idle.

Miss Mary E. Green read an interesting report on temperance among the Hawaiians.

Mrs. President Whitney's paper was on the progress of temperance in America, in fact throughout the world.

The meeting was a very interesting one.

A New Ten-ton Roller.

One day last week a ten-ton roller and shaft at the Pahala mill were broken to pieces. In some way or another the Honolulu Iron Works heard of the accident on Saturday, and they immediately set to work to cast a new roller. On Tuesday Mr. Fuller, the manager, arrived in town to see about a new roller when he found that work had already commenced on it. Yesterday afternoon it was cast with success, and it will take until Monday to cool. It is the largest roller on the Islands. The casting was witnessed by a number of people. The mill has had to stop grinding, and the new roller will leave here on the W. G. Hall November 4th.

Coal News from Newcastle.

Dulgey & Company's monthly circular dated Newcastle, N. S. W., October 1st, in referring to coal says: Business is entirely suspended; the mines are all idle, and the only work done during the month was the shipment of remainder of the coal produced before the strike commenced. There are various opinions as to the probable date of the termination of the strike, but it is hazardous to venture any opinion regarding it.

It is reported that the name of W. H. Stone has been given to the Legislative select committee as the person who wrote the anonymous communication in the Bulletin, on Oct. 15th, reflecting on the members of the Legislature.


