

GOOD NEWS.

A Duty on Sugar and Our Treaty Safe.

The bark Albert arrived this morning with six days' later news from the Coast. She brings a confirmation of the good news predicted in the GAZETTE. The revised tariff bill has been submitted to the Senate. It fixes a duty of about 1 1/2 cents per pound on sugars testing 96 per cent, the duty on sugars polarizing 80 per cent. being fixed at 1 cent, with a graduating rising scale from that point up. It is proposed to insert a clause abrogating all the reciprocity treaties except that with Hawaii, and to strike out the clause which was intended to terminate the Hawaiian treaty.

Rear Admiral Walker has been ordered to Honolulu to replace Admiral Irwin, who retires. It is said this is to counteract a rumored movement to establish a British protectorate, Admiral Walker being an officer in whom great confidence is placed.

Sister Belina Elizabeth, of the Catholic Mission, died on Sunday night and was buried yesterday afternoon. She was 58 years of age and had lived in this country for a great many years.

It was said yesterday, and on the authority of a prominent royalist, that the resolutions passed at the mass meeting last evening were forwarded to Washington by the Monowai.

Mr. Wellesley A. Parker, who is preparing the illustrations for "The Hawaiian Revolution," has secured permission from President Dole to have full access to the Government archives for any matter he may desire to use.

A petition for signatures has been circulated among the Portuguese residents for several days, requesting their home Government to send a warship to this port. Up to date about 300 names have been secured. A petition has been sent to the other islands also.

Natives resident at Pukoo, Molokai, are dissatisfied with the appointment of inspectors up there, two of whom, they declare, are Government officers. They have addressed the Executive on the subject in certain resolutions, protesting at the same time their loyalty to the Provisional Government.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of Act 69 of the Provisional Government of the Hawaiian Islands, being an Act entitled "An Act to Provide for a Constitutional Convention," notice is hereby given that an Election for Delegates to the Constitutional Convention will be held throughout the Islands, between the hours of 8 o'clock A. M. and 5 o'clock P. M. on WEDNESDAY, the 24 day of May, 1894.
