THE CHINESE TREATY.

Some of the Provisions of the Bill to Carry it Into Effect.

WASHINGTON CITY, Aug. 15.—Mr. White (Democrat), of California, yesterday introduced in the Senate a bill to supplement and carry out the provisions of the Chinese treaty. It provides that Chinese laborers, on leaving the United States with the intention of returning shall make oath before the Collector of Customs of the port of departure to a full statement, as required by the treaty, and furnish proofs of the facts entitling them to return under regulations provided by the Secretary of the Treasury. False swearing will make the affiant liable to prosecution for perjury. The Collector is authorized to issue a certificate if he believes the Chinaman is entitled to return, and its transfer to another person will make it void and prevent its original holder from returning to the United States. Every Chinese laborer holding a return United States certificate shall have the right to enter the United States at the point where issued. Masters of vessels are obliged to report whether they have any Chinese on board, and failure to do this will render the offender liable to punishment by a fine of not more than \$5000, or by imprisonment for not more than five years, or both. Persons who change, alter or forge this certificate are made liable to punishment by a fine of not more than \$1000, or by imprisonment not exceeding five years, or both.

The Panama Canal Frauds.

PARIS, August 4.—Dr. Herz, who was connected with the Panama canal frauds, and who is residing in England, has been found guilty of contempt of court and sentenced to five years' imprisonment for not appearing to defend the charges against him.
