The barkentine S. G. Wilder is due today from San Francisco.
The steamer Kaula will be laid up for a general overhauling.

The collier Butehshire is taking on ballast at Fishmarket wharf.
The steamer Mazama sailed for Lahaina and Panalua yesterday.

The steamer Noeau sails for Honolulu and Kukuhaele at 10 o'clock this morning.
The barkentine Amelia, which arrived from Port Blakeley with a lumber cargo yesterday, was wind bound in Chatham Bay for three days.

The big collier Grenada is discharging 500 tons of coal at Oceanic wharf. At Port street wharf, where the Grenada discharged the coal out of her forward hatches, there was not enough room to unload the coal from the after hold.

Said Commander Rinder, of the Belgic just before the sailing of that liner for San Francisco last Wednesday night: "Well, the passengers who sailed by the Australia will be surprised when they find our passengers already landed in San Francisco when they get there." This means a race.

The troopship Arizona, now loading at Pacific Mail wharf may not sail for Manila until Sunday. Eleven hundred and twenty-five tons of coal were on board the Arizona last night and an additional seventy-five tons and the two hundred tons of stores that are on Pacific Mail dock will be loaded this morning. At 2 o'clock this afternoon the Arizona will move out. In the stream to make way for the liner Doric due from San Francisco this evening.

The barkentine S. G. Wilder sailed from Honolulu with an assorted merchandise cargo. California Wines.

Advertisements indicate that the yield of these wines this season is in the neighborhood of 8,000,000 gallons, as against 27,000,000 gallons last year. Sweet wines will show about one-half the production of last year.

MARTIN J. EGAN.
Chronicle Correspondent Returns From Manila.
Martin J. Egan, correspondent for the San Francisco Chronicle at Manila as a passenger on the Belgic en route for the Coast. He has been stationed at Manila since the land operations commenced and has followed very closely the movements of the American forces. When asked regarding the situation Mr. Egan replied that: "The differences between the American forces and the insurgents had not at any time been as serious as the public had been led to believe, although there might yet be serious trouble in dealing with them."

As regards the climate Mr. Egan says that although it is not all that can be desired, yet a white man by taking proper care of himself can withstand it. Much of the sickness among the soldiers can be traced to their own negligence. The American troops, Mr. Egan says behaved gallantly while under fire of the enemy, and the American people have every reason to feel proud of the defenders of the flag. He believes that the opportunities for success from a business standpoint will in a short time be excellent in the island of Luzon. The country is in a very poor state of development but with Spanish rule wiped out and quiet again restored the commercial interests of the group will come to the fore.

PARIS, Oct. 29.—An evening newspaper announces that Captain Dreyfus is already in Paris, and is now confined in the fortress at Mont Valerien, to which he was secretly brought.

LONDON, Oct. 29.—Major Count Esterhazy, who has publicly denied the London Observer's assertion that he had claimed to be the author of the Dreyfus bordereau, will sue the Observer for libel.
