WRIGHT WANTS HAWAIIAN LEAF

SEATTLE, January 5.—Mike Wright, a Seattle cigar manufacturer, has just returned from a four months' trip to Honolulu, where he went to encourage Hawaiian planters to grow tobacco. He has contracted with several tobacco farmers to take their entire output, and is making an effort to introduce Havana tobacco extensively in the islands.

COMPLAINTS OF THE KINAU.

Capt. W. A. H. Connor, in charge of the Federal dredging contract, has complained to Lieut. Slattery, U. S. A., that the officers of the steamship Kinahu kept her propellers going all Tuesday forenoon, causing the water to wash out the bottom of the slip into the excavation made near the end of the slip by the Pacific. The Federal contract has nothing to do with deepening the slips, and therefore Captain Connor claims the action of the Kinahu was not in good form.

ADA AND LADY SAFE.

The schooners Ada and Lady arrived in port yesterday morning, after water-fronters were concerned over their long trips from their respective ports. The Ada struck unusually rough weather between Lahaina and Honolulu, and seven days were necessary to make the trip. The Ada lost part of her rigging as well as her jib-boom. At one time Captain Mana brought his vessel within three miles of Diamond Head when he had to change his course and beat out to sea again. The Lady came in yesterday afternoon.

JAPAN'S WAR.

(Continued from Page 5.)

old is torn down. Thus it is reasonably certain that the simple archaic structures with their rudely thatched roofs which one sees today at Ise are in all points identical with the primitive hut shrines in which the Japanese worshipped before the beginning of the Christian era. The solemn avenues of ancient cryptomerias, which lead up to the shrines through long stretches of gloom, deepen this impression of great antiquity.

Here it was that the present Mikado returned thanks for the victorious ending of Japan's greatest war. On that day, November 17, the wheels of government and of business were stopped and the entire empire reverently observed the event.

What the Japanese themselves thought of the occasion may best be seen from the editorial comments of the time. Passing by the intensely loyal remarks of the pro-Government Kokumin, we find the following in two of the leading independent journals. The Nichinichi said:

The present imperial visit to the Great Shrine, when viewed in parallel with the numerous precedents in which his Majesty has attributed the victories of the imperial hosts to the virtues of his ancestors and to the efforts of his people, make clear how truly and boundlessly the Emperor is devoted to the living spirits of his forefathers and how deeply he loves his subjects. In other words the Emperor aspires to be the embodiment and living example of universal humanity, filial piety and humility.

The Asahi said:

We modern Japanese are luckier than all our forefathers, in living to see so grand an event as the present imperial pilgrimage to Ise, as the like of it, with all the glories it implies, has never before occurred in the history of the empire. Our present Emperor is the rejuvenator of Japan and has given her a new history. Furthermore, his Majesty intends no doubt to renew in us the spirit of traditional faith and worship, as this his fourth visit to the Great Shrine clearly indicates.

The Japan Times, in referring to the projected pilgrimages of the Empress and the Crown Prince, remarked that such visits, especially that of the Empress, had no precedent in the history of the empire.

It is safe to say that not for 1200 years has Shintoism been so emphasized as it is today. The work of revival began in the eighteenth century, but made little progress for the Mikadoes were then still under the thumb of the Shoguns. In 1868, when the imperial house was restored to power, the revival was again pushed forward, but the work done was chiefly destructive and expended itself in clearing away the ornate buildings, pagodas, etc., and the florid decorations with which Buddhism had adapted the Shinto establishments to its own purposes. That movement was strong enough to lead the art loving Japanese to sacrifice many precious objects of national art to the reformers' zeal, but still the work was negative.

The revival of today is vigorous and positive, and doubtless, like all other movements connected with the war, has been carefully planned and timed to the occasion. It certainly makes plain that whatever changes take place in her outward appearance and however much her sphere of influence shall widen Japan at heart pledges herself to "keep faith with the dead."
