GENERAL SUMMARY.

The mean temperature for the week was the same as that for the preceding one at Kohala Mission, Hawaii, Haiku, Maui, and Waia-

The rainfall for the week, as a rule, was greater than that of the preceding week, the exceptions being -1.54 inches at Kealakekua (1580 feet), Hawaii, and -0.52 inch at Kealakekua (1450 feet), Hawaii, and no rainfall at Puunene, and Wailuku, Maui; Ewa, and Waianae, Oahu, and Elelele, Kauai. Excesses over the preceding week, ranging from 1.00 inch to 1.52 inches, were reported from Kau-

No rainfall has occurred during the last three weeks at Wailuku, Maui, and during the last five weeks at Puunene, Maui, and but .35 inch during the last six weeks at Kihai, Maui.

At the local office of the U. S. Weather Bureau, clear to partly cloudy weather obtained, with measurable amounts of rainfall on four days, which amounted to .22 inch, an excess of .11 inch for the week. The mean temperature for the week was 77 deg., a deficiency of 1 deg. The maximum temperature was 83 deg., and the minimum 71 deg.; the average relative humidity was 69 per cent.; average cloudiness 4-10; prevailing direction of the wind was northeast, with an average hourly velocity of 8 miles; mean barometer 30.04 inches, ranging from 30.05 to 30.00 inches.

ISLAND OF HAWAII.

Kaunama (21)—Warm, partly cloudy weather obtained, with showers on five days. Light northeast winds prevailed. Mean temperature 73.3 deg., and total rainfall 2.16 inches.—J. E. Gamalison.

Hilo (21)—Rain occurred on five days. Light winds prevailed. Mean temperature 74.8 deg., and total rainfall 1.74 inches.—L. C. Lyman.

Papaikou (21)—Warm, generally cloudy weather obtained, with occasional showers daily. Total rainfall 1.85 inches.—John T. Moir.

Pepeekeo (21)—Generally partly cloudy weather obtained, with rainfall on five days, and amounting to 1.95 inches. Mean temperature 75.2 deg.—W. H. Rogers.

Honoumou (21)—Warm weather continued. The rainfall was heavier and amounted to 4.72 inches.—Wm. Pullar.

Hakalau (21)—Warm weather in daytime, with showers during nighttime. Light winds prevailed. Mean temperature 75.3 deg., and total rainfall 1.82 inches.—Hakalau Plantation Co.

Honohina (21)—The weather during the week was much cooler, with daily rains amounting in all to 2.75 inches.—W. Elliot.

Papaalooa (21)—Showery, except on the 18th. Moderate winds prevailed. Total rainfall 1.90 inches.—C. McLennan.

Laupahoehoe (21)—Very warm, fine weather, with light showers on five nights. Calm sea. Total rainfall .57 inch.—E. W. Barnard.

Ookala (21)—Warm and sultry, generally partly cloudy weather obtained, with showers on four days. Mean temperature 74.0 deg., and total rainfall 1.57 inches.—W. G. Walker.

Papaouli (21)—Warm, generally partly cloudy weather obtained, with rain squalls from the east on three days. Fog observed at medium altitudes. Moderate east winds. Mean temperature 75.6 deg., and total rainfall .35 inch.—C. R. Blacow.

Honokaa (21)—Showers occurred on two days, and amounted to .49 inch. Mean temperature 74.4 deg.—S. Gundelinger.

Niuli (21)—High temperatures obtained, with light showers, and prevailing east winds. Mean temperature 75.4 deg., and total rainfall .68 inch.—F. C. Paetow.

Kohala (21)—Generally clear and warm weather, with light showers on five days. Mean temperature 74.5 deg., and total rainfall .69 inch.—J. M. Souza.

Kohala Mission (21)—Generally partly cloudy weather obtained, with rains excepting on the 16th and 15th. Mean temperature 74. deg., and total rainfall .80 inch.—Dr. B. D. Bond.

Puakaia Ranch (21)—Warm weather, with rain on three days, and trade winds prevailed. Mean temperature 73.5 deg., and total rainfall .31 inch.—A. Mason.

Puuhoe Ranch (21)—Beneficial showers occurred on three days. Temperatures higher than the average. Light trade winds prevailed. Total rainfall .66 inch.—S. P. Woods.

Kamuela (21)—Sunshine, drifting clouds, and light showers on four days. Strong trade winds prevailed. Mean temperature 66.2 deg., and total rainfall .48 inch.—Mrs. E. W. Hay.

Kealakekua (21)—Showers occurred on five days. Mean temperature 71.5 deg., and total rainfall .87 inch.—Rev. S. H. Davis.

Kealakekua (21)—Fine weather, with showers on three days. Light easterly breeze on 14th about 7:30 p. m. Total rainfall .34 inch.—Holt Wallace.

Nanalehu (21)—Weather very warm, with two light showers. Total rainfall .32 inch.—G. G. Kinney.

Pahala (21)—Showers on the 17th and 18th. Mean temperature 74.2 deg., and total rainfall .34 inch.—H. D. Harrison.

Kapoho (21)—Warm weather, with daily showers. Mean temperature 74.8 deg., and total rainfall 2.16 inches.—H. J. Lyman.

Olas (21)—Partly cloudy and cloudy first three days, clear the remainder of week. Warm, dry days, with rainfall on all days, generally occurring during nighttime. Mean temperature 74.8 deg., and total rainfall 2.16 inches.—F. McLennan.

ISLAND OF MAUI.

Hana (19)—The weather continued warm and dry, although the amount of rainfall was an increase over that of last week; a good downpour needed. Trade winds prevailing.—N. Omsted.

Nahiku (21)—Quite warm, clear weather during the daytime, and light showers at night on the 15th, 16th and 17th; the remainder of week, showers in daytime. Light trade winds. Total rainfall 2.48 inches.—C. O. Jacobs.

Huelo (21)—Generally fair weather, with rain on the 16th, 17th and 18th instants, and showers on the remaining days. Trade winds prevailed. Mean temperature 72.8 deg., and total rainfall 2.21 inches.—W. F. Pogae.

Peahi (21)—Warm days, with rains at night, amounting to 1.95 inches. Light trade winds prevailed.—Geo. Groves.

Haiku (21)—Warm and generally clear weather obtained, with 89 per cent of sunshine, and gentle rains at night. Moderate trade winds prevailed. Mean temperature 74.0 deg., and total rainfall .87 inch.—D. D. Baldwin.

Pala (21)—Very warm and dry weather obtained, with light showers on three days, which amounted to but 15 inch. Trade winds variable. The present indications are for heavier rains. Mean temperature 76.0 deg.—J. J. Jones.

Puunene (21)—Weather very dry, and water scarce in the ditches fed from Nahiku. High winds from north and northeast during daytime. Mean temperature 79.4 deg., and no rainfall.—J. N. S. Williams.

Wailuku (21)—Clear to partly cloudy, rainless weather obtained. Very warm days, and warm nights. Regular "trades" blowing. Week closed with slight indications of rain. Everything very dry. Mean temperature 78.7 deg.—Bro. Frank.

Kihai (19)—A pleasant change from the late very warm and dry weather took place on the 18th, when welcome showers, which however, were very local, occurred. Previous to this change the temperatures were slightly higher. Ditches continue dry, and pumping is necessary. Mean temperature 78.5 deg., and total rainfall .35 inch.—James Scott.

Kaunapali (21)—Weather very warm, with a maximum temperature of 91 deg. on 18th, and but a trace of rain. Moderate to fresh northeast winds prevailed the first and middle portions of the week, becoming strong and squally the latter part. Mean temperature 78.8 deg.—Wm. Robb.

ISLAND OF OAHU.

Maunawili (21)—Higher temperatures. Rainfall occurred, excepting on 23rd, mostly at night. Mean temperature 77.0 deg., and total rainfall .80 inch.—John Herd.

Waimanalo (21)—Showers occurred on three days. Mean temperature 79.4 deg., and total rainfall .34 inch.—A. Irvine.

Ewa (21)—Weather continued warm and cloudy. A trace of rain fell on the 21st, and .01 inch on 22nd. Mean temperature 78.1 deg.—R. Muller.

Waianae (21)—Another week of very warm weather, with nearly cloudless skies, an average cloudiness of 210, and no rainfall. Rain is greatly needed over this entire district. Mean temperature 81.1 deg.—F. Meyer.

Waiawa (21)—Light showers on four days. Mean temperature 73.5 deg., and total rainfall .31 inch.—W. R. Waters.

Kahuku (21)—Clear and sunny days obtained, with light showers, amounting to .34 inch, on five days, and continued high temperatures, the mean being 77.4 deg.—R. T. Christopherson.

Makaweli (21)—Clear weather, with rain on 18th. Rain is needed. Strong winds caused weather to feel more comfortable. Mean temperature 79.8 deg., and total rainfall .93 inch.—Hawalei Sugar Co.
