SLASHED PARAMOUR WITH A RAZOR

"It was the drunk that did it," explained Maile, a strapping, big Hawaiian woman, to the Sheriff yesterday when he asked her why she had found it necessary to scalp George Kaal with a razor and slash him across the breast with the same weapon on the evening before. The excuse might have helped in explanation of the cutting scrape but was not any logical reason why Mary and George have been living together for the past several years without the ordinances respecting marriages having been taken into account. So there will be no prosecution for assault on the part of the police in order that the Federal authorities may proceed with a prosecution under the Edmunds Act. George Kaal is one of the sailors of the steamer Iwawani, who, after being paid off on Monday morning, loaded up with sundry gin and went home. Here he and Mary celebrated, sending out for more palm tree when the supply ran low. By evening both had acquired a fighting disposition and in the fracas which followed the woman secured a razor and slashed merrily. One of the blows landed on George's head, putting a gash in the scalp that took twelve stitches to sew up. Another gash slit the right breast from the armpit to the middle of the chest. In spite of the severe wounds received, Kaal did not come into town to report the occurrence until late yesterday afternoon, appealing to the police for medical treatment but explaining that he did not wish to make any complaint against the woman. At the police station he only exhibited the slashes on his chest and it was not until he was taken to the Queen's hospital that it was discovered that his scalp was more than half severed. United States Attorney Breckons has taken charge of the case and will proceed against the pair. Yesterday the custody of the woman was surrendered to him by Sheriff Iaukea and a warrant is out against the man, to be served as soon as he is turned out of the hospital.

NATIVE KNOCKED DOWN BY AN AUTOMOBILE

A native named Kaahala was knocked down by Dr. Sinclair's automobile on Beretania, near College walk, yesterday at noon, but the machine had been slowed down to avoid the accident and the man was only slightly injured. The native had not heard the auto approaching and stepped off the sidewalk in front of it, walking right into its path as the driver swerved to avoid him. He was struck with the front of the auto and knocked on his face, but the machine had been braked and only about half the length of it passed over him. He was taken to the Queen's Hospital by Dr. Sinclair and his injuries attended to. These consisted of some bruises and lacerations on the arms and feet, but nothing to prevent him coming to the police station an hour afterwards and telling his story. The first report made to the police was brought by Dr. Sinclair, who came direct from taking the man to the hospital to report to the Sheriff.

MR. LONGWORTH SEES FEDERAL JUSTICE HERE

Congressman Longworth, on the invitation of District Attorney Breckons, yesterday paid a visit to the premises in the Judiciary building connected with the Department of Justice of the United States. On this occasion he had an opportunity of watching proceedings in a case of dispensing Federal justice in this Territory where aliens are concerned. This was the examination of a Japanese named Hirano on two separate charges by U. S. Commissioner George A. Davis. One of the informations accused him of bringing females into the United States for immoral purposes. The other charge was that of a personal violation of the Edmunds Act. Hirano was bound over to the Federal grand jury in both cases, his bonds being \$1500 in the first and \$600 in the second one. "Mr. Longworth showed a deep interest in the proceedings, as well as a thorough grasp of the legal aspects of the matters involved," Mr. Davis said afterward. "From his experience on committees of Congress he knows a great deal about the problems that have to be met by the Federal authorities here. This was very evident from the remarks made in conversation with Mr. Breckons and myself. You know Mr. Longworth was in Congress long before his marriage to the President's daughter. "He is a bright man and it was easily gathered from his conversation that Hawaii will have a good friend in Congressman Longworth after his present visit to the Territory."

De Young the Alarmist

LONDON, July 27.—The Tribune's view this morning prints an interesting note with M. H. de Young of San Francisco, explaining the situation in his city and denying the existence of race prejudice against the Japanese, but maintaining that Japan wants the Philippines primarily and the Hawaiian Islands if she can get them. The Tribune, in an editorial, thinks that such a view of Japan's intention, soberly set forth by an American of influence and position, contains more matter for alarm than any mere race prejudice on the part of a mob which wrecks restaurants. At the same time, the Tribune declares, it can not believe that Japan has any such designs until there is better evidence of it than has yet been adduced. The Tribune proceeds to comment on a recent article in Harper's Magazine with reference to the alleged disposition of Emperor William to enter into an agreement with the United States for the reciprocal defense of German and American possessions in the Far East, and expressed great surprise that any doubt could arise as to whether Great Britain values most the friendship of the United States or of Japan. It says: "The Americans are our natural friends, and should be the last to misconceive the meaning of an Anglo-Japanese alliance."
