## ALLIES TO EXACT OF ISLAM STRICT WAR NEUTRALITY

LONDON, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—It seems today unlikely that the Allies will accept the mere apology proffered by the Grand Vizier of Turkey to Great Britain for the action taken by the Turkish fleet in bombarding Russian ports in the Black Sea.


It is probable that the demands made on Turkey to prevent formal declarations of war against her will include demobilization of the Turkish levies, the removal of the Turkish troops from Egyptian territory, the withdrawal of German officers from the Turkish army and navy, and the internment of the battle cruiser Goeben and the cruiser Breslau.

Turkey expressed her willingness to withdraw all warships from the Black Sea, where hostilities were precipitated.

The Turkish ambassador at the Court of St. James has been given his passports.

Vienna reports that fighting between Russians and Turks has begun on the frontier near Trebizond, a Black Sea port in Asia Minor.

## BRITAIN ORDERS MILITARY RULE IN ALL EGYPT

LONDON, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—Great Britain has proclaimed martial law throughout Egypt, and the commander-in-chief of the British forces in Egypt has taken supreme command.

He has been ordered to suppress all outbreaks of military force.

Dispatches from Odessa state that little damage was done by the Turkish bombardment. No Americans were injured.

Petrograd reports an engagement between the Turkish warships and the forts at Sebastopol. Small damage was done in the city and an intercepted wireless message from the Goeben said the vessel was damaged and was returning to Constantinople for repairs.

The prefect of police at Petrograd has ordered all Turks expelled from the city within a week, according to Reuter's advice.

Paris reports the accumulation of evidence that Turkey intends to declare a "holy war" upon the Allies and to call out the millions of Moslem subjects.

The Serbian minister is preparing to leave Constantinople.

# KAISER GOES TO FRONT IN FLANDERS

## Progress In Eastern Campaign Reported From Berlin and Vienna

### RETREAT OF LEFT WING OF GERMANS IN POLAND IS CUT OFF BY RUSSIANS

LONDON, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—Reports from Petrograd by Reuter's Agency say that the Russians have cut off the retreat to Posen of the left wing of the German army of invasion, which has been defeated in the fighting west of Warsaw.

The rear guard of the German forces is reported partially surrounded by Russians near Lodz.

**OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT OF PROGRESS**

The official announcement from Petrograd says:

"On the East Prussia front our troops have repulsed German attacks directed against Vladizlavoff.

"We advanced north of Lake Raigorod.

"Beyond the Vistula we continue offensive unopposed.

"The Austrians in the region of Opatow, in Radom, have been repulsed."

**RUSSIANS LOSE HEAVILY IN POLAND**

Vienna reports that the fighting against the Russians in Poland continues, and that the Russians have lost heavily at the San river, especially at Rosjadow.

Berlin announces officially that events in Poland indicate the resumption of fighting between the Austro-German forces and the main Russian army.

Marconi advices from Berlin quote a Cracow dispatch as saying that the Russians have been driven across the San river, and dislodged from Leizayak, with the Austrians in pursuit.

**AUSTRIANS STILL HAMPER SERVIANS**

Vienna announces officially that the Austrians are maintaining their successes in Serbia and are advancing at Macva over a wide front.

Dispatches from Petrograd say that Russia has ordered all German and Austrian subjects to leave Russia within two weeks.

### WILHELM PLANS TO LEAD HIS TROOPS IN ANOTHER ONSLAUGHT UPON ALLIES

LONDON, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The official announcements from the French and Belgians yesterday and last night, together with the advices received from press correspondents at the front, indicate that the Germans are preparing for a new attack in view of the success of the Allies in checking their movement to the sea.

The Belgian official announcement says:

"The arrival of the Kaiser, who is expected in southern Flanders, indicates that the German objective is now between the river Lys and the town of Ypres.

**GERMANS EVACUATE ON LEFT**

"Yser front is inactive. The Germans have largely evacuated the left bank of the river.

"Between Dixmude and Bixchoote the Allies continue to make progress."

The official announcement from Paris last night confirms the Belgian announcement regarding the fighting in Flanders, and adds:

"Between the North Sea and the river Oise the German attack continued during the day, but with less violence than yesterday."

**ALLIES WITHIN FOUR MILES OF OSTEND**

The press advices to the Daily Mail and London Times say that the Allies have fought their way back within four miles of Ostend, which is reported to be held by a small German garrison.

The Times' correspondent telegraphs that the Allies have penetrated north and east of Lille, "which certainly has been evacuated by the Germans."

It is reported that an alleged intercepted message from the Kaiser to the King of Wurtemberg declared it absolutely necessary that the Germans take Ypres before November 1, otherwise they will have to withdraw behind the river Rhine.

A Marconi wireless dispatch from Berlin reports that the Germans are making highly favorable progress at Soissons and Verdun, but says nothing about the fighting in Flanders.

### GERMAN CRUISERS LOCATED

VALPARAISO, November 3.—(Associated Press by Commercial Cable)—Somewhere off the South American coast the German cruisers Nurnberg and Leipzig are now pursuing their mission as commerce destroyers and maintaining a sharp lookout meanwhile in dodging hostile warships.

Off Carranza Point yesterday the Nurnberg stopped the Chilean steamer Chiloe and inquired the whereabouts of the British warships in these waters.

The Leipzig has called for provisions at Juan Fernandez, a small island 400 miles off the coast of Chile.

### CONSUL RODIEK GETS REPORT

The following cablegram from official German sources was furnished The Advertiser yesterday by the German consul general:

"The Karlsruhe and Dresden captured the Lamportholt liner Vandyck in the south Atlantic.

"Eight Turkish corps have invaded Egypt.

"We have made progress in France, Galicia and in Serbia."

### HUGE RANSOM EXACTED OF BRUSSELS

AMSTERDAM, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The Germans have fixed the ransom of Brussels at \$9,000,000 payable half a million weekly.

### American Cities Organize Belgium Relief

SAN FRANCISCO, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—Scores of cities throughout the country are organizing committees to secure immediate relief for the starving Belgians. The condition of this people is described as appalling.

### Three Million Belgians Are Starving

NEW YORK, N. Y., November 2.—Walter H. Page, U. S. Ambassador to Great Britain, has cabled to Norman Haggood, the New York editor, that 3,000,000 Belgians are suffering actual hunger.

### NORTH SEA MILITARY ARENA

LONDON, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—Yesterday the British Admiralty declared the whole North Sea a military area.

The Admiralty has sent out a warning to all merchantmen to beware of submarine mines.

### BRITISH FORCES AT FRONT LARGE

The British forces at the front are estimated at 300,000. Many additional auxiliary vessels of the navy are serving for transport purposes and as supply depots.

### GENERAL VON MEYER KILLED

A report from France says General von Meyer of the German army was killed last Friday, but does not state where.

### MORE CANADIANS ARE READY

OTTAWA, November 3.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The second contingent of Canadian troops—15,000 men—now ready to leave for the front, is composed of two brigades of infantry, with the full complement of artillery, engineers, bicycle corps, signal corps, and administrative units to make it complete.
