

RUSSIAN AND MOSLEM FLEETS ARE ENGAGED IN TERRIFIC BATTLE

Entrance of Turkey Into European War, It Is Predicted, Must Draw Entire Levant, Italy, Greece, India and All of Asia Into Titanic Struggle of Nations

CONSTANTINOPLE, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—A portion of the Russian Black Sea fleet and the Turkish fleet are reported to be engaged in a general naval battle off Odessa.

The Russians have three new dreadnoughts, three battleships, eight years old and two battleships of the first class, seven submarines and a large fleet of destroyers, but what forces are in the reported fighting is not announced.

TURKISH FLEET IS INFERIOR

The Turkish fleet available consists of one dreadnought and two modern battleships, supplemented by the German battle cruiser Goeben, with two modern cruisers and the German cruiser Goeben. In the Turkish navy are also two torpedo gunboats, eight destroyers and nine torpedo boats. What ships of these are operating in the Black Sea is not announced.

Allies Adopt Waiting Policy

Bordeaux, France, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Turkey's entrance into the war was considered by the cabinet yesterday, to the exclusion of other business. It was announced that there is complete solidarity among the Allies and that the attitude of Turkey will not complicate the situation so far as the joint attitude of Russia, France and Great Britain. The Allies, for the present, will adopt a waiting policy, to see what effect the action of Turkey will have upon the Balkan States and Italy.

Destroyers Shell Two Cities

PETROGRAD, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—It is learned that in addition to the naval activity already reported as carried out by the Turkish and Turco-German vessels, destroyers have shelled the cities of Novorossiysk and Odessa, sinking the Russian destroyer and damaging the French merchantman Portugal.

Turkey's Entrance Spreads War

WASHINGTON, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Far-reaching developments were caused by the entrance of Turkey into the European war. The hostilities begun by the Turco-German warships Breslau and Goeben against Russia will involve the Balkan states, Greece, Italy, and Asia, including perhaps India.

'HOLY WAR' NOW PROBABLE

The effect of Turkey's action upon the millions of Moslems in Egypt, Persia, Arabia, and India, because of the possibility of a "holy war" is a matter of grave interest.

ISLAM MAY DISAVOW HOSTILE ACTS

Advices from London say that it is suggested in official circles that Turkey may disavow responsibility for the hostile acts committed by the two warships when the attitude of the Allies becomes known. It is thought that Turkey may endeavor to throw the blame for these acts upon the German commanders of the Breslau and Goeben.

GREAT DEMONSTRATIONS IN DAMASCUS

Great demonstrations are reported from Damascus against the Christians, especially the English. Bedouins are said to be massing on the Egyptian frontier.

IRISH DODGE CONSCRIPTION

NEW YORK, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Four hundred Irishmen arrived here yesterday. It is reported that they migrated from Ireland because they heard that the British government was seen to put into force a conscription policy and that they would be forced into the army and sent to the front.

RUSSIAN VICTORY INDICATED

PETROGRAD, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—The war office announces officially that reports from the front indicate victory for the Russian forces.

TWO NATIONS NOW AT WAR HAD PLANS TO INVADE UNITED STATES

PRINCETON, New Jersey, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Theodore Roosevelt, addressing the student body yesterday, stated that he had personally seen and studied the detailed plans drawn up by two of the empires now at war, for the capture of the seaports of San Francisco and New York, with the object of holding these cities for ransom at a sum that would cripple the country and at the same time provide the funds for carrying on the war against the United States.

PROMOTION BOOMS ON PACIFIC COAST

Reports From Zeno K. Myers and Rep. A. P. Taylor Tell Hawaii Boost Work Social Work

The London Times said yesterday: "The Allies are quite ready for Turkey. By her foolish yielding to war at Germany's instigation she pronounced her own doom. The Ottoman Empire in Europe will soon be merely a memory. Syria Arabia and Mesopotamia will likewise be freed. The Turk will be relegated to the obscure valleys of Asia Minor."

Turkey Opens Hostilities

The following cablegram received yesterday from official German sources was furnished The Advertiser by Consul Geo. Rodiek: "Turkey opened hostilities in Black Sea. The Goeben sunk two Russian steamers at Kertsch. The Breslau bombarded Feodosia. The Turkish cruiser Hamidieh demanded the surrender of Novorossiysk. A Turkish torpedo boat sunk Russian gunboat at Odessa. The Russian ambassador has left Constantinople."

One Honolulu In Turkey

As far as could be learned last night, Miss Gladys Stephenson daughter of Stanley Stephenson, 1677 Beach road, this city, is the only Honolulu who is now in Turkey. News that the Moslems were making great demonstrations against the Christians in Damascus and possibly in other portions of the Turkish dominion, as both in Europe and Asia, was received by Mr. Stephenson last night with some fear for the safety of his daughter.

EVEN MEXICO JUMPS ON HELPLESS BELGIUM

MEXICO CITY, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Paul May, the Belgian minister to Mexico was yesterday handed his passports. He is alleged to have received aggressive and disrespectful notes to the Mexican government.

SPAIN WILL BUILD MANY NEW WARSHIPS

MADRID, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—For the rehabilitation of the Spanish navy the minister of marine yesterday introduced a bill providing for the construction of four cruisers, six torpedo boats, twenty eight submarines, three gunboats, and in addition some needed coast defenses.

CARRANZA AND VILLA ARE BOTH ELIMINATED

EL PASO, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—It was reported here last night that the Agnes Callientes convention had eliminated Carranza and Villa, by accepting the resignation of Carranza as provisional president, which carried the condition that Villa retire from official life.

SENATOR PITTMAN BADLY BEATEN BY HIS OPPONENT

RENO, Nevada, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Senator Pittman of Nevada was one of the principals in a street fight here yesterday, resulting from a political discussion. The senator was badly punched by his opponent.

ALLIES ARE DRIVING TEUTONS INTO HEART OF BLEEDING BELGIUM

Germans Have Been Compelled To Withdraw Inland From Coast, While They Lose Ground South of Dixemude and Finally Evacuate Ostend

PARIS, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—Official announcements from the war office at Paris yesterday and last night describe further success by the Allies operating against the Germans in northern France and in Belgium.

GERMANS ARE LOSING IN BELGIUM

South of Dixemude the Germans have lost ground, according to the announcement and the French troops are progressing south of Paschendalle and Beelaere, in Belgium, and have taken many prisoners.

ARTILLERY DOES DEADLY WORK

Earlier despatches from France yesterday said the French and Belgian artillery had severely punished the Germans in their retreat from the Belgian coast, and that the French and British corps east and northeast of Ypres had repulsed violent assaults by the Germans and driven them back.

REPORTS CLOUD SITUATION

LONDON, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—The reports regarding the situation in Belgium, as issued by the official press bureau here and as given from Berlin, in the official statements, are very far from agreement.

BRITISH ADVANCE, SAYS LONDON

"Severe fighting continues along the length of the Allies' line, being particularly fierce in the north, where the German resistance is stubborn and where they are making frequent counter attacks," says the British report, containing: "We are making steady progress, however, the British gaining ground with every attack."

GERMAN LOSSES ARE TERRIFIC

A Reuter's despatch says: "Today's news from the front is excellent. Several points of extra strategic importance are occupied. The Allies are making progress along the entire front. The German losses are terrific."

BERLIN CLAIMS SUCCESS

An official statement issued at Berlin, received by wireless, says: "Our attacks from south of Nieuport, Belgium, to the east of Ypres are being successfully continued. Yesterday more British prisoners, to the number of two hundred, were taken, with eight machine guns."

GERMANY THREATENS REPRISALS

Through Ambassador Page, the German government yesterday notified the British government that if the German civilians in England, with the exception of those under suspicion, be not liberated by November 5, all British subjects now in Germany will be similarly arrested and held as prisoners.

FISHER SUCCEEDS BATTENBERG

Sir John Fisher, baron of Kiverton, today succeeded Prince Louis of Battenberg, admiral of the fleet. It is said that Prince Louis resigned because his Austrian birth and German connections made his tenure of office the subject of newspaper criticism.

LADEN HOSPITAL SHIP LOST

WILTBY, England, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—The British hospital ship Bohilla, a 7000-ton vessel, while bound for Belgium, ran onto the rocks and broke in two a mile south of here in a gale before dawn this morning.

Revolution Spreads In China

TOKIO, October 31.—(Special by Cable to the Nippon Jiji).—Advices from China say that the revolution is spreading. Reports of rioting in Canton have been received here.

TSINGTAU BEING SHELLED

TOKIO, October 31.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless).—The British Indian contingent has joined the Japanese and British forces investing Tsingtau, and the war office announces officially that a general attack is now in progress, with the Allies shelling the fortress.
