

TROOPS ON RIO GRANDE LOAD GUNS FOR REBELS

American Border Patrol Receives Orders To Shoot, If Necessary, To Prevent Armed Filibusters From Crossing Into Mexico

Fighting Among Factions At Naco Becomes Severe and Two More Persons On American Side Are Wounded By Stray Bullets

Zapata Still Holds Mexico City and Villa is Near To Escort 'Provisional President' Gutierrez Into Seat of Government

WASHINGTON, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—Following the receipt of information yesterday that 700 Mexicans, who had been recruited in Texas, had crossed the Rio Grande to join the Mexican armies, orders were issued to the troops on border patrol at San Antonio to shoot, if necessary, to prevent armed filibusters from crossing the border into Mexico.

BULLETS FLY ACROSS BORDER

Telegrams received from Naco last night said that the battle for the possession of the Mexican town was still in progress, and that two more persons on the American side of the line were wounded during the day by stray bullets. Naco, Mexico, is the object of a vigorous attack, and is making a strong resistance.

TROOPS TO INTERCEPT VILLA

Reports received from San Antonio yesterday say that three hundred Caranistas had been despatched from Nueva Laredo to Reynosa, and that three hundred reinforcements were following. The object of this force is to intercept reinforcements to the Villa troops who are believed to be planning the capture of Reynosa, in Matamoros.

ZAPATA HOLDS MEXICO CITY

General Zapata continues to occupy Mexico City with his forces and yesterday assured the American government that his troops will preserve order in the Mexican capital and afford full protection to foreigners. At the same time a telegram was received from Orizaba at Vera Cruz, asserting his determination to fight on until he had gained the mastery by force of arms.

VILLA IS NEAR CAPITAL

General Villa, at the head of an army of 25,000 men, entered the suburbs of Mexico City yesterday. He announced he would not visit the capital until Provisional President Guiterrez arrives. In his statement, Villa said that his only mission is to restore order, and that he did not intend to take personal vengeance on anybody. He said Guiterrez is the supreme power in Mexico, and that he, Villa, is merely field commander of the armies.

Gale Forces Bering Sea Ice-Pack Onshore At Nome, Causing Floods

NOME, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—A furious blizzard has been in progress for the past three days and the force of the gale has forced the Bering sea ice-pack on shore where the tremendous pressure of wind and water had driven it up against the backs of buildings near the waterfront.

All the lowlands are flooded and the wind is driving the water farther inland, making the trails impassable. Several mining camps are surrounded by flooded districts, and much discomfort will ensue, if not actual hardship.

Second Officer Who Was Lost Was Responsible For Improperly Altering Course

SAN FRANCISCO, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—Testifying at the coroner's inquest today regarding the loss of the steamer Hannela a few days ago, Capt. William Carey of the wrecked schooner testified that had the second officer, Pease, held the course given him, the Hannela would have passed a mile outside Duxbury reef.

The captain declared that Pease altered the course when he thought he heard a whistling buoy and admitted his fault just before the vessel struck. Pease was one of those lost with the steamer.

Late this afternoon the jury exonerated Captain Carey. The jury found that the lifesaving equipment is inadequate and recommended that a new station be established at Bolinas, opposite Duxbury reef.

TOKYO, December 1.—Japan's budget for 1915 was made public today. One of the significant items is to finance the military extension plan to Korea, for which an additional appropriation of 240,000 yen is made.

GERMANY HAS 58.5 CORPS IN FIELD

Twenty-One and a Half Are Fighting Allies in France and Belgium

PARIS, December 2.—(Associated by Federal Wireless)—A semi-official estimate of the present available military strength of Germany on the fighting line was made yesterday, the statement showing that of active and reserve troops there were now fifty-eight and one-half army corps in the field.

FOUR CORPS IN EAST

Of the twenty-five and a half army corps made up of the active troops, the Germans are now employing twenty-one and a half against the Allies in France and Belgium, with the other four corps engaged on the Russian front.

There are now at Germany's disposal thirty-three corps made up of reserves, of which number twenty-two and a half are operating in the western theater of the war and ten and a half in the eastern theater.

AVAILABLE FORCE 2,500,000 MORE

A German army corps of three brigades consists of 43,000 men. The available German army, active and reserve, consists, according to this statement, of slightly under two and a half million men.

The statistics presented on the war map of Central Europe prepared in the War College, Washington, gave the strength of the Germans at the beginning of the war as 800,000 in the standing army and 3,200,000 trained reserves. Untrained reserves were estimated at an additional 3,000,000.

During Year To Date 3651 Persons Have Been Killed and 100,000 Injured

WASHINGTON, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The mixing bureau has just published a list of the casualties in the various theatres throughout the United States for 1914, up to the present time.

The total number of persons killed in mine disasters and accidents was 3651, and approximately 100,000 persons were injured during this period.

The percentage of killed is in the ratio of 3.49 per cent; per thousand persons employed in mines. Joseph A. Holmes, director of the Bureau of Mines, arraigns the system which permits this needless slaughter of laboring men.

ARBITRATION TREATY RENEWED BY AUSTRIA

WASHINGTON, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The Austro-Hungarian embassy yesterday announced the ratification by Vienna of the renewal of the general arbitration treaty with the United States for a period of five years.

NEW YORK, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—An organization to be known as the National Security League has just been formed here, with the object of conducting a countrywide campaign for the enactment of such legislation as may be needed to provide a military and naval establishment which will be ample for the defense of the nation under all circumstances.

Famous Sailor and Scholar Dies in Washington, Leaving Brother in Honolulu

WASHINGTON, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The funeral of the late Rear Admiral Alfred T. Mahan, retired, who died yesterday, will be held this evening from St. Thomas' Episcopal cathedral. In accordance with the last expressed wishes of Admiral Mahan the services will be simple in character. There were no military ceremonies yesterday for this reason. Tomorrow the body will be taken to Queen, Long Island, the admiral's former home, for interment.

Rear Admiral Alfred Thayer Mahan, retired, died yesterday afternoon of heart disease in Washington, D. C. Commodore Denis Mahan, also retired, a brother of the late admiral, who is at present in Honolulu, received a cable message yesterday afternoon announcing the death of the admiral.

Admiral Mahan was regarded as one of the world's greatest authorities on the naval matters and his writings were accepted as authoritative, while his text books were standard throughout the world's navies. He was a profound scholar all his life, and had written many works which commanded the attention of the foremost naval experts and were accepted literally in England. Author of "Celebrated Book."

Work Has Revelation

He had then arrived at that mature experience and age where he could follow out and set down his conclusions logically, and his very deliberately set about the outlines of his great work. The very title itself, "The Influence of Sea Power Upon History," he selected after much deliberation, in order to couple up words which would instantly attract attention, and be succeeded.

This work came as a revelation to every government in the world, encouraging the grasp for colonial expansion and water navies. In the opinion of Englishmen, this work was selected after much deliberation, in order to couple up words which would instantly attract attention, and be succeeded.

Son of West Point Professor

The son of a West Point professor, the late admiral was born in New York City in 1840, and graduated from the naval academy in 1859. He served through the civil war in the federal army, and was on active service ashore and afloat for many years thereafter.

His foremost principle in naval strategy was to have the greatest possible hitting power concentrated in a fleet, not necessarily on the smallest number of ships, which had disadvantages as he made plain. He advocated ships of sufficient size, speed, protection and armament to cope with any fleet, but thought it undesirable to make any attempt to outclass other nations in the size of ships.

SAUERKRAUT AND TOBACCO PROVE CARGO OF SUSPECT

Authorities of Port Suspect Its Mission

San Francisco, December 2.—(Associated Press by Federal Wireless)—The activity of the port officials in scrutinizing the papers of departing tramp steamers since the suspected violation of neutrality by the recently American registered steamer Sacramento, yesterday resulted in the charterers of steamer Olson & Mahony withdrawing application for clearance. The Olson & Mahony was under charter by the Golden Gate Transport Company, of which George and James Food are the principal owners.

CARGO APPEARED SUSPICIOUS

The S. S. Sacramento, formerly the German steamer Alexandria, put into Valparaiso on November 22, reporting that she had been seized by a German warship, taken to Juan Fernandez Island and forced to transfer her cargo of provisions and coal to the belligerents. The port officials refused to credit the tale of the force and seizure and began to investigate the cargoes of other steamers about to sail for South American ports. The cargo of the Olson & Mahony appeared suspicious. It consisted of a large consignment of sauerkraut, tobacco, condensed milk and other food stuff.
