

PARIS REPORTS SAXONS LOSE. BERLIN SAYS FRENCH LOSE

Germans Are Said to Have Suffered Great Loss and Sustained Heavy Reverse in Violent Attack at Ypres and La Basse

LEGIONS OF THE KAISER SUCCESSFUL AT CRAONNE

Near Perthes Violent Attacks of Teutons Are Repulsed While Austria and Russia Both Announce Victories on Battle Line

(Associated Press by Federal Wireles.) LONDON, January 28.—Paris dispatches yesterday report that the Germans failed in a violent attack at Ypres and La Basse, losing heavily, while Berlin reported that the German operations at Craonne were successful, the French losing their position, with many wounded and prisoners.

FOUR ATTACKS REPULSED

"Near Perthes yesterday we repulsed four violent attacks on Hill No. 200. New footbridges thrown by the enemy across the Meuse at St. Mihiel have been destroyed. The situation in Loraine and Vosges is quiet."

AUSTRIA CLAIMS GAINS

In regard to the eastern situation, both the Russians and the Germans claim to have been successful in an engagement at Pilikallen, eighteen miles northeast of Gumbinnen, in East Prussia, while Austria claims to have gained the ascendancy in the fights for the possession of the Carpathians. Vienna reported officially last night the recapture of Ustok Pass.

GERMANS ARE DISLOADED

The official announcement from Petrograd yesterday said: "The Russian general staff declares that on Monday the Russians assumed the offensive in the Pilikallen region and dislodged the enemy at the point of the bayonet from many positions. No important changes are taking place in Silesia."

RUSSIANS ARE REPULSED

According to the operations near Pilikallen, the Berlin despatches claimed: "Northeast of Gumbinnen the Russians attempted a number of attacks but were repulsed with heavy losses. Regarding the fighting in the Carpathian Mountains, Vienna's earlier announcement stated: "The Russians have been forced to evacuate important heights in the passes leading to northeastern and northwestern Hungary. They were driven out of strong positions after repeated fruitless and costly counter attacks against the Austro-German forces."

FROM GERMANY EMBASSY

The local German consulate has received the following cable summary of the war situation from the German embassy at Washington: "The governor of Southwest Africa in a report confirms the British defeat at Sandfontein on September 25. Three English squadrons were annihilated by the Germans, who took prisoners fifteen officers, including the commander, Colonel Grant, and 200 men. They also took two guns."

IN EUROPE

Franz Josef Prepares To Quit Throne

Desiring Peace, Aged Emperor of Austria-Hungary Will Abdicate Dual Monarchy

(Associated Press by Federal Wireles.) GENEVA, Switzerland, January 28.—According to apparently well authenticated reports which have reached here from the Austrian crown lands in the Tyrol, where Emperor Franz Josef has been living, the aged ruler of the Dual Monarchy is making the arrangements to abdicate in favor of his nephew, the Archduke Karl Franz Josef, who became heir to the throne on the assassination of the Archduke Francis Ferdinand at Sarajevo on June 28 last, the incident which precipitated the war.

EMPEROR DESIRES PEACE

The aged Emperor desires peace and has expressed himself to Kaiser Wilhelm. Owing to the refusal of the German ruler to agree with him, either as to the desirability of ending the war or by the military policy that should be adopted otherwise, the Austrian Emperor has decided to step aside to order that Austria and Germany may continue in accord.

ABDICATION EXPECTED SOON

Vienna dispatches have been received that the Emperor definitely decided upon this course after a visit had been paid him by the Archduke and Foreign Minister Baron Stephan Burian. The formal announcement of the abdication is expected within a week.

LONDON, January 28.—Advice from Belgium to the Daily Telegraph last night said that General von Blomberg, the new German military governor of Belgium, has ordered the arrest of all English non-combatants residing in that country. They are to be transferred to Germany.

THAW IS ON TRIAL IN NEW YORK COURT

(Associated Press by Federal Wireles.) NEW YORK, January 27.—Harry K. Thaw, under indictment in this state for escaping from Matteawan asylum for the Criminal Insane, went to trial today. He pleaded innocent. His trial was set for February 23. Meanwhile Thaw will remain in the Tombs. The State has agreed not to attempt to send him back to Matteawan unless it wins the verdict at the trial. The attorney general today terminated the services of William Travers Jerome, former district attorney, employed as special counsel for the State in the proceedings to extradite Thaw from New Hampshire. The attorney general, in terminating the arrangement with Jerome, said that his duty was ably performed when Thaw was returned to New York. The State will conduct the trial without assistance.

TURKISH ARMY CORPS MARCHING ON EGYPT

(Associated Press by Federal Wireles.) ATHENS, January 27.—It is reported here that three Turkish army corps under Djemel Pasha are marching upon Egypt.

CAIRO, January 27.—A British sea plane has discovered Turkish troops near Bismarck and dropped bombs on them, inflicting considerable losses. Great military activity is taking place in the vicinity of the Suez canal, which is heavily guarded against possible attack by the Moslems. A small Turkish advance guard was encountered yesterday east of El Kantara. Large bodies of troops are also reported at three other points east of the canal.

PERITION LOST ON MONDAY BUT THE ATTACK BROKE DOWN UNDER THE FIRE OF THE GERMANS.

"The fight on the heights of Craonne, mentioned yesterday, has been entirely successful for the Germans. The French were thrown out of their positions on the elevated points west of Lacroute Fine and east of Hurtebise and were pushed to the southern slope. Several important French positions were stormed by the Saxons and 800 unwounded French prisoners taken, as well as eight machine-guns, one pioneer depot and much other material.

MARCH 1 IS LAST DAY TO REPORT

Collector of Internal Revenue Coltrill Announces Recently Promulgated Regulations

With the time rapidly drawing to a close, for the submission of the second year's returns by corporations under the income tax law, Collector of Internal Revenue Coltrill has announced a number of recently promulgated regulations of material importance to taxpayers of all classes. The report also includes regulations pertaining to the emergency revenue, or war tax bill. Returns on income tax are due on or before March 1.

Individuals Desiring to file claims for exemption with withholding agents must do so not later than March 1.

The list of these rulings follows: Individuals desiring to file claims for exemption with withholding agents must do so not later than March 1. The law is mandatory on withholding agents, and if they have in their hands some other persons of a taxable amount, they must withhold the normal tax and must withhold on the total amount unless claim for exemption is filed within the time specified.

Corporations Must Report

All corporations, except those specifically exempted by law, must submit a report, whether there is an income to report or not. Requirement is not based on income, but is mandatory as to a report. The exemptions specified by law are as follows: Labor, agricultural or horticultural organizations; mutual savings banks without capital stock represented by shares; fraternal beneficiary societies, orders or associations operating under lodge system, or for exclusive benefit of the members of a fraternity itself operating under a lodge system; and providing for the payment of life, sick, accident and other benefits to members; domestic building and loan associations; cemetery companies for mutual benefit to members, and all similar institutions.
