

Badges and souvenirs—J. D. Miller.


Reception—The board of supervisors, the city council of the city of Carthage and the committee.

#### An Important Decision in the Interest of Labor.

Last week Judge Willcockson, of Sigourney, handed down a decision in the case of Thompson vs. the Iowa Mine Workers of America and granted a perpetual injunction in favor of the Mine Workers. This is the case in which Major Lacey represented the Mine Workers. This decision involves an interesting question. The Mine Workers have accumulated a large benevolent fund of nearly \$300,000, and the tax ferrets of Oskaloosa got the fund assessed for a term of years, the tax amounting to about \$16,000.

Major Lacey was employed by the Mine Workers to defend against this tax. The case was tried a couple of months ago and Judge Willcockson has sustained the contention of Major Lacey that this is a benevolent fund and exempt from taxation. This decision will interest the labor unions generally, who attempt to accumulate funds for defense and charity.
